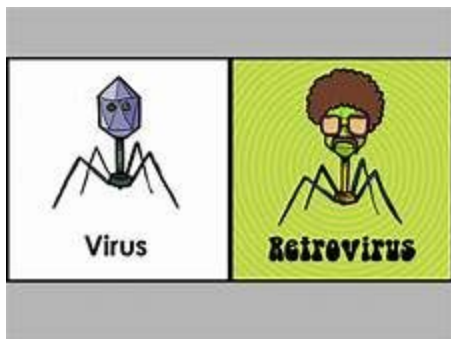
## \*\*\*\*\* Busy Week Next Week!!

## Box Tops

The way we collect Box Tops is changing! Historically, we have clipped Box Tops from boxes of crackers, cereals, soup can and even parchment paper. The money we earn from all our clippings (10 cents per Box Top) goes straight to our school and is used for classroom supplies and other needs.

**How- 1. Download the Box Tops for Education app; 2. Scan your receipt; 3. Earn Money**

The best news is that during this transition, our school can get twice the amount of earnings for each Box Top-10 cents for eligible items on scanned receipts and 10 cents for the clipped Box Top. Earn money for Butteville via Box Tops via the Box Tops for Education app, but also keep clipping Box Tops until it phases out completely. Turn clipped Box Tops either to your teachers or the front office!

**This spring give the gift of the GOTR experience to your 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> grade girl!**

Parents/Guardians – We are happy to announce that our school will be hosting a **Girls on the Run** team this spring for girls in 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> grade.

**Registration will open January 21 at 6:00 AM on a FIRST COME, FIRST SERVE basis.**  
**The season begins the week of February 24<sup>th</sup>.**

***Girls on the Run is WAY more than a running program.*** Through dynamic, conversation-based lessons and running games taught by certified Girls on the Run coaches, Girls on the Run is a safe supportive place for your girl to build her confidence, find friends, and learn life-skills to help her navigate her world.

Meeting twice a week in small teams of 8-15 girls running is used to teach girls how to set a goal, slowly work toward it and accomplish it while encouraging lifelong health and fitness and building confidence through accomplishment.

GOTR-certified volunteer coaches follow a research-based curriculum that covers topics such as:

- how to turn negative self-talk into positive self-talk
- how to understand their emotions
- how to choose good friends and be a good friend
- how to show gratitude and express empathy
- how to deal with gossip and handle peer pressure
- and SO MUCH MORE!

At the season's conclusion, the girls will complete the GOTR 5K (3.1 miles) fun run in Redding Saturday, May 9<sup>th</sup>. Completing the 5K gives the girls a tangible sense of achievement as well as a framework for setting and achieving life goals.

*The result—making the seemingly impossible, possible and teaching girls that they CAN.*
