













Sixth Crown In Past 19 Seasons Tigers Roar To Victory And Secure CKL Crown









Sprinting against Chapman, Veryl Peter clocked an excellent 10:18 to boost Clay Center to a 23-60 win.


At the CKL meet, Clay ranked fourth with a score of 108

Coach Friesen stated that the squad did so well this year because boys placed third, fourth, and fifth to help the team score.




Wrestlers Win 6 Out Of 8






It was senior Harvey Frigon who changed the third record of the season when he lofted the javelin 190-6 to top the regional field.






