

Miss Ruth Raynolds is retiring after forty-three years of teaching, thirty-nine of them in CCCHS. For twelve years she taught English and the first classes in junior-senior speech, coached debate, and directed plays. She completed work on her Masters degree. Miss Raynolds specialized in teaching junor English and started the first classes in senior English. For about twenty-five years she was Dean of Girls and sponsor of the Junior Deans, an organization of senior girls appointed to assist other girls. She was active in the state organization, serving on the Council of the Kansas Association of Teachers of English. In addition to degrees from the University of Kansas, she has studied at Colorado University; Columbia University, N. Y.; Tulsa University; Kansas State Teachers College at Emporia; and Kansas State College. In 1959 she spent five weeks on a National Council of Teachers of English travel and study tour of the British Isles.








