Parking Rules and Regulations

In order to provide a safe climate for all students, the following rules and regulations have been established regarding the operation of motorized vehicles on the Benton High School Campus.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. Students are expected to register their vehicles prior to driving on the school grounds and appropriately display the school issued tag at all times.
- 2. Students may park in areas designated as "Student Parking" only. **Do not park in "visitor", "staff" or** "handicapped" parking without prior administrative approval.
- 3. After arrival at school, students will park and lock their vehicles, then move immediately to the high school building. Students will not loiter in or around the parking lot. Students are not permitted to return to their vehicles without approval from the principal or his designated representative at any time during the school day.
- 4. The operation of a vehicle on campus is a privilege that can and will be revoked if a student fails to abide by these regulations or operates a vehicle in a hazardous fashion.
- 5. Vehicles should be kept locked at all times.
- 6. Students must have liability insurance coverage.
- 7. Speed limit on campus is 5 mph and you must obey the stop signs.
- 8. Any vehicle parked on campus is subject to search.

VIOLATION/PENALTIES

Students who fail to abide by the parking rules and regulations will be subject to disciplinary action. Consequences may include warning, Saturday School and/or loss of on campus parking privileges and suspension. The severity of the offense and the students previous on campus driving record will be major factors in assessing the consequences. Failure to register a vehicle parked on campus will result in a minimum of Saturday School.

SERIOUS OFFENSES

Any student who operates a vehicle in such a manner as to endanger life or property shall be dealt with on an individual basis by the principal or her designated representative. The violations will carry a severe penalty.
