

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Your school has partnered with Margaret Mary Health to offer a vaccine clinic during school hours in the near future. MMH's staff will review your child's immunization record and vaccinate according to the chart below.

Insurance Please contact your insurance company to verify eligibility, coverage, and location limitations. Some insurance companies will not cover vaccines administered in the school setting. Immunizations are billed as 'preventative' and may be covered under the wellness category of your insurance plan. Our provider is Lynn Tyrer, PA-C. The insurance company makes the final determination of your eligibility and coverage.

Vaccine for Children Program The Vaccine for Children Program provides vaccine at no cost to children 18 years and younger who have no insurance, Medicaid or have insurance which doesn't cover vaccines.

K – 5th grades	3 doses of Hepatitis B 5 doses of DTaP 4 doses of Polio 2 doses of Varicella 2 doses of MMR 2 doses of Hepatitis A	Hepatitis B: The minimum age for the 3rd dose of Hepatitis B is 24 weeks of age. DTaP: 4 doses of DTaP/DTP/DT are acceptable if 4 th dose was administered on or after child's 4 th birthday. Polio: 3 doses of Polio are acceptable for all grade levels if the 3rd dose was given on or after the 4th birthday and at least 6 months after the previous dose. *For students in grades K-10, the final dose must be administered on or after the 4th birthday and be administered at least 6 months after the previous dose.
6th – 11th grades	1st dose of Meningitis (MCV4) 1st dose of Tdap 2 doses of Hepatitis A if have not received yet Catch up on any required vaccine(s) listed above	Varicella: Physician documentation of disease history, including month and year, is proof of immunity for children entering preschool through 12th grade. Parent report of disease history is not acceptable. Tdap: There is no minimum interval from the last Td dose.
12th grade	2nd dose of Meningitis (MCV4) 2 doses of Hepatitis A if have not received yet Catch up on any required vaccine(s) listed above	MCV4: Individuals who receive dose 1 on or after the 16th birthday only need 1 dose of MCV4. Hepatitis A: The minimum interval between 1st and 2 nd dose is 6 calendar months. 2 doses are required for all grades K-12.

Recommended Vaccine:

HPV Vaccine (Human papillomavirus) protects against genital warts and cervical cancer. For ages 9 to 14, two doses are recommended separated by six months. For those 15 through 45 years, three doses are recommended at 0, 2, & 6 months.

Meningitis B Vaccine Many colleges including IU, Purdue, Ball State, etc. are requiring the Meningitis B vaccine. It is a series of 2 doses separated by approximately 6 months for 16 to 23 year olds
