

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION ACADEMIC DISTINCTIONS

Policy Code: 3455

Each high school senior, upon receiving a diploma, will be ranked in his or her class. Class ranking shall be determined by the final grade point average in all subjects counted as diploma units.

(Un-weighted grade point average) all classes are equal using a 4.0 grading scale.

(Weighted grade point average) honors courses receive an additional 0.5 credit per course on a 4.0 grading scale. College transfer courses and AP course receive an additional 1.0 credit per course on a 4.0 grading scale.

Section A:

Valedictorian/Salutatorian:

The valedictorian shall be the senior with the highest weighted grade point average during the student's freshman, sophomore, junior, and senior years (this is determined by averaging all grades in all subjects to be counted as diploma units). The salutatorian shall be the senior student with the second highest grade point average using the same determination. Grades will be calculated at the end of the final grading period of the senior year. In order to be considered for this honor, students must be in attendance at the same high school their junior and senior year. In the event that there is a tie for valedictorian and salutatorian, the use of an academic based rubric will be used to break all ties.

Section B:

Latin Honors designation based on weighted grade point average:

Martin County high schools will designate all graduating seniors, who meet the weighted academic grade point average, with Latin Honors as detailed below.

1. Students with a 3.75 - 3.99 weighted grade point average shall receive the distinction of (cum laude).
2. Students with a 4.0 - 4.249 weighted grade point average shall receive the distinction of (magna cum laude).
3. Students with a 4.25 or higher weighted grade point average shall receive the distinction of (summa cum laude).
4. The administrative procedure set forth in Section B shall govern all students entering the ninth grade for the first time in 2014-2015 and each year thereafter.

The administrative procedures set forth in Section A shall govern all Martin County graduating high school students.

The administrative procedures set forth in Sections A **and** B shall govern all Martin County students entering the ninth grade for the first time in 2015-2016 and each year thereafter.
