 - Writing Committee
 - Working on District Strategic Goal of Proficiency in Writing
 - Teachers created 2 assessments to measure grade level proficiency in writing
 - Grade K, 1, 2, 3, 5 Teachers created prompts (Argument/Informational, Narrative), rubrics, checklists, and tools for recording data for all grade levels.
 - Teachers will communicate procedures with colleagues at their grade level, as well as above and below grade level to develop consistency with the across the district.
 - The committee will meet in February to go over data and touch base on where we are in the full implementation process.
 - Science Committee
 - Met on 11/6/19
 - Reviewed all programs in use: Stemsscopes, Mystery Science, TCI Science
 - Will no longer use TCI Science
 - K-3 will use Mystery Science, we have a district subscription, so 4th & 5th may use to supplement
 - 4-8 will use Stemsscopes

- K-4 teachers are working with Nicole Williams (STEM teacher) to make sure they are not overlapping science concepts. They will create a rough Scope and Sequence for each grade level and we will meet as a mini committee in January or February.
 - We will not look at new curricular options
 - Would CLT like to see an example of a Mystery Science lesson next time?
