Dear Parents, Students, and District Stakeholders,

I have a few items to share with you. First is something that isn't necessarily new news, but it will officially happen in a couple of weeks. On February 5th or 6th, Pender will be publicly recognized as a 2019 ESEA National Distinguished School at a ceremony in Atlanta, Georgia! Pender received this award due to exceptional student performance and academic growth for two or more consecutive years. This is quite an honor for Pender Public Schools. Everyone who has contributed to PPS's success in the last few years should feel proud of their efforts. That includes parents, community members, and all other district patrons. In particular, students and staff members should be proud of their efforts. PPS was 1 of 100 schools in the nation to receive this recognition. In other words, this isn't something that happens all that often.

Five staff members will be in attendance to accept the award. The ceremony will be broadcast online, so anyone interested in watching will be able to do so. When more details about the specific date, time, and broadcast are available, they will be shared. It is important to note that while in Atlanta, the staff members in attendance will also be able to participate in professional development activities. These activities are designed to help Pender in ways that can make us even more successful.

Anytime an award of this nature is earned, there are a couple of important things to do. First, it is important to celebrate. As I alluded above, this award is special. It took a lot of hard work, commitment to excellence, perseverance, and grit to get this award. Celebration is important! It is hard to believe but as we enter February and early March our Winter sports seasons will be winding down with Conference, District, and State competitions. Please make sure to view the activities calendar for all of these events going forward. Don't hesitate to call with any questions as well. Weather can always play a factor and things may need to be rescheduled.

This time of year I will begin to put together the schedule for the 2020-2021 school year. As we increase our numbers with the larger classes moving in from the elementary, Mr. Nixon and I have worked hard to put together the best possible schedule for all students to be successful and take the classes they want. As is the case, not all students will be able to take all the electives they want but we will work hard to give them the best options possible. This time of year Mr. Nixon will begin meeting with the students to put together their 20-21 schedules. Students are updating their Personalized Learning Plans (PLP's) and trying to pinpoint their best options for their future. We invite any parents who are interested in seeing what their kids may want to take to stop in and talk with Mr. Nixon during Parent Teacher conferences.

Speaking of P/T conferences, they will take place on Wednesday, February 19, from 3:00-9:00PM. All parents are invited to stop in and talk to teachers about any concerns or questions they may have regarding their child's grades. We are hoping to have a few other events at P/T conferences this year but will get more information out on that as we get closer to the date. Once again we will have a survey for parents to fill out during PT conferences. This information is vital to that administration and helps us to gather information and possibly make needed changes to the district.

Winter MAP testing will begin for students in grades 7-10 during the week of February, 18! In the Secondary, Measurements of Academic Progress (MAP) tests are taken in the fall and late winter. Teachers use these to help guide students in curriculum and to get them ready for our state's NSCAS tests and the Pre-ACT and ACT in High School. Pre-ACT was already given to the sophomore class in November and will be added this year for the freshman class in the spring. It will take place in April shortly after the Juniors take the ACT. This is new for our district but we feel it is an important step to give our teachers much needed data to support students in their academics. This will also help the freshman class become more familiar with the test that will be used to assess their career and college readiness.

As always, please make sure and check the school calendar for all other activities. There are a multitude of events coming up as your Pendragons participate in winter activities. I look forward to seeing you all out and about as the snow melts and we head towards our spring events.

Hello Pendragon Families!

I hope 2020 is off to a fantastic start for you and your family! The New Year has certainly been good to us! We are all actively preparing for some important things that will be taking place in the next couple months here at PES.

MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) and Aims Web testing were completed prior to winter break this year. All students K-6 participated in MAP & Aims Web testing. K-1 students took a reading & math test. 2nd-6th grade students took reading, math and language tests, 3rd-6th grade students added Science as well. MAP & Aims Web tests are designed to give teachers information that in turn can be used to change/individualize instruction for maximum student progress. MAP testing is also great practice for upcoming NSCAS tests as well as a predictor of NSCAS success.

NSCAS testing (formerly known as NeSA testing) is one of the most important things we prepare for each year. ELA, Math and Science tests (for 3rd-6th graders) will be taken during the window of March 16 – April 24. The results of these Nebraska Student Centered Assessment System Tests (NSCAS) are the yardstick by which every school district in the state is measured, so we take these tests very seriously.

You can help us prepare your child for a positive testing experience by assuring he/she is well rested. Helping them make good choices nutritionally is also important so their minds and bodies are fueled and ready. Remind your children testing is an opportunity to showcase how hard they have worked and how much they have learned. Please look for more information regarding specific NSCAS test dates to come home in Thursday Folders in the near future. If you have any questions regarding NSCAS/MAP testing please feel free to give me a call.

We have some wonderful opportunities coming up here at school that will allow time for parents to join student in some educational fun! The Spelling Bee, Read Across America Day, Science Night and our NSCAS recognition assembly are right around the corner. Preschool registration night and Kindergarten Round-Up will be here before you know it as well! Please look for information specific to those events in Thursday folders.

Finally, we are looking for a few folks to share their skills and talents with our students. We are in need of volunteers to help with reading and math interventions. Additional mentors are also being sought for the Pender Teammates Chapter. Donations for the Backpack Food Program continue to be accepted as well. I hope you consider spending some time with us! I would like to take this time to hopefully ease some of the stress by letting everyone know that communication with me will always be open for any questions and assistance in the college preparation process. I have made many connections with other people and counselors since arriving at Pender that are also willing to assist any student pursue their dreams. I believe that the entire staff, the administration, and the school board have all had a part in creating an atmosphere that will help every student make a smooth transition to whatever their steps after high school are. It's a great day to be a Pendragon!

Seniors...make sure you complete the FAFSA process

Getting financial aid for college involves more than completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Complete each step of the process so that you don't miss out on money for college.

- 1. If you haven't already, complete your 2020-21 FAFSA at FAFSA.gov using 2018 income tax data. Before you start, you and a parent must each get an FSA ID at fsaid.ed.gov as you'll need them to access and sign your FAFSA.
- 2. Expect a Student Aid Report (SAR) via an email link. The SAR acknowledges that your FAFSA was received and lets you know if you need to take further action before the form can be processed.
- 3. You might receive a verification notice from the college(s) you listed on your FAFSA requesting documents to verify your FAFSA information. The college will not process your financial aid until you provide required documents.
- **4. Watch for financial aid award notifications.** Once you're accepted for admission to the colleges you listed on your FAFSA, they will notify you of the types and amounts of financial aid they're offering.

Watch your email and student portal carefully for important details about admission and financial aid.

What you need to know about scholarships

Most scholarships are based on academics, but others are based on community service, school involvement, or talent. Some are based on financial need as determined by the results of your FAFSA. Here's where to look for scholarships:

- 1. **ScholarshipQuest** at EducationQuest.org houses over 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships. After you create a profile, you'll be matched with scholarships that fit your criteria.
- 2. School counselor's office. Visit regularly to check on local and national awards.
- 3. **The college you plan to attend**. Contact the school for a list of scholarships they provide and the application procedures.
- 4. National search sites such as College Board, Peterson's, and Chegg.
- 5. **Other resources** could include your coach, clubs and organizations, and your parents' employers and civic organizations.




