OLWEUS Anti-Bullying Chalk Walk Kickoff

Adopted by the Palmyra School District in 2014, OLWEUS is the best-known and most researched bullying prevention program that exists today. Incorporating students, all building staff, family, and the community. OLWEUS helps students differentiate between conflict and bullying, and empowers students and those around them to stop the bullying.

This year Charles Street School celebrated the kickoff with a "chalk walk!" What is a chalk walk? Students in preschool through sixth grade got to decorate sidewalk squares with anti-bullying slogans and pictures. Decked out in their new OLWEUS shirts, which were provided to all students and staff members by the Palmyra Education Association, students and families got a chance to parade around the school and admire the chalk illustrations of fellow students. The students and their families reconvened in the gymnasium for an anti-bullying assembly and dancing thanks to fantastic music provided by DJ Tamier. 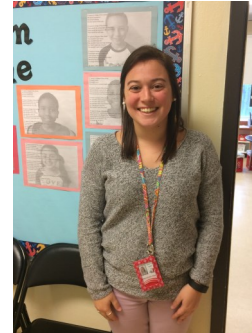
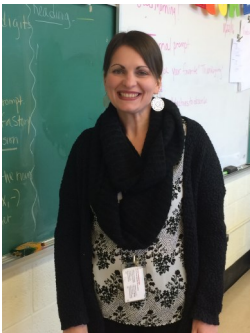
