

Dear Parents:

Enrollment for current 9th-11th grade students will begin in February. All financial aid applications, scholarship applications and enrollment fees must be paid by March 6th. If the March 6th 2020 payment of fees creates financial difficulty for a family, please contact the business office to discuss your situation with them. Fees are \$100.00 per student. If you have not made arrangements with the business office and the per student fee of \$100.00 has not been paid by March 6th the student fee will increase to \$150.00. Please be sure to pay your fees before the due date of March 6th in order to secure your child's seat in his or her class. We do anticipate a freshman class of at least 90 students. Because of this anticipated growth we will need to have our upper level class enrollment numbers in place prior to the incoming freshman enrollment date in March. We appreciate your anticipated help in getting your student fee paid on time as this secures your student's seat in his/her class and helps us in our planning process for course offerings for the up coming school year.



Enrollment for the 2020-2021 school year will begin February 2020!

Timeline

February: Enrollment paperwork arrived in your home. This included a financial agreement and enrollment agreement. **Only one financial agreement is needed per family.**

To apply for financial aid, visit online: factsmgt.com.aid. Enrollment Fees are due to the Business Office. **Students will not be able to choose classes with a counselor until enrollment fees and all documents have been submitted.**

Please turn in financial agreement to the business office and enrollment agreement to Mrs. Sanchez in the front office.

April: Tuition letters will be sent to homes.

June 15: First tuition payment for the 2020-2021 school year is due.

Students will not be allowed to pick out classes until families have enrolled with the Business Office.

SENIOR CLASS NEWS



Dear Seniors and Senior Parents,

As graduation approaches, we wanted to give you some important information about dates and financial obligations to help you with your planning. There will be a Senior Class meeting on Monday, April 6, during homeroom where all of this information, along with additional details, will be covered.

All of the deadlines for the Seniors will be strictly enforced. Some of these dates are set by outside vendors, and they will not accept any late additions or changes. It is extremely important for you to be prompt in sending money, forms, orders, etc. when they are due.

Here are some important deadlines for you to remember (in calendar order).

- --Senior Class Fee: The Senior fees that were due <u>August 1</u> included the graduation fee. There is no additional graduation fee this year.
- --Senior Dinner Tickets: Dinner tickets for all those (other than graduates) attending the dinner must be purchased from Miss Lipovitz by <u>Friday, May 1, at 3:30 p.m</u>. NO TICKETS WILL BE SOLD AFTER THIS DEADLINE! Tickets will be \$25.00 per person. (Please see the enclosed letter on the next page for information regarding dinner ticket limit and seating assignments.)
- --Obligations: All obligations, including fees, tuition, fundraising money, detentions, sports equipment, fines, etc. must be completed by <u>May 1</u> and Service Hours are due by <u>April 7</u>, so Seniors can receive their exam waivers. If Senior obligations are not fulfilled by May 1, the student will not receive his/her cap & gown and will not be allowed to participate in graduation activities.
- --Service Hours: All Service Hours must be completed and submitted by April 7.
- --All-School Senior Mass: The All-School Senior Mass will be held on Thursday, May 7, at 2:15 p.m. in the auditorium. Parents are welcome to attend.
- --Retreat: The Senior Retreat is mandatory for ALL seniors and will be held on a date to be determined in May Seniors must report to school by 7:45 a.m. and will return to school by 3:15 p.m. Transportation will be provided by BWHS.
- --Graduation Practice: Practice for graduation will be Tuesday, May 12, at Memorial Hall at 11:15 a.m. This is REQUIRED for ALL seniors to attend. Seniors will report to Memorial Hall immediately following final exams that day. Seniors who do not drive will be bussed to Memorial Hall. Carpooling is encouraged for all other seniors as parking at Memorial Hall will be limited Practice will not start until ALL seniors are present.
- --Baccalaureate Mass/Graduation: Baccalaureate Mass will be held Sunday, May 17, at 2:00 p.m. at St. Mary-St. Anthony Church, 7th & Barnett, in Kansas City, KS. Graduation will be Sunday, May 17, at 3:30 p.m. at Memorial Hall. Graduates need to report to the Memorial Hall basement by 1:00 p.m. wearing cap and gown. We will process over to the church together for Mass and return in the same way.

Graduates and Faculty ONLY are allowed in the basement area. Please take family pictures before Mass or after the graduation ceremony. Professional graduation pictures (with the graduate wearing cap & gown) will be set up in the basement of Memorial Hall. Price information will be sent home in April. Seating is available on the floor of Memorial Hall for guests with special needs. If you have a family member who needs seating assistance, please let Miss Lipovitz know by May 10 at noon so seats can be set up at Memorial Hall. The guest with special needs and ONE family member will be allowed to sit on the floor section, not the entire family.



Dear Senior Parent/Guardian:

This letter is to inform you of important dates and deadlines concerning your Senior student. Please pay careful attention to these deadlines as no extensions will be given.

- 1. The Senior fees you paid at the start of the school year included the graduation fee. If you have not yet paid the Senior fee, a separate letter will be mailed to you with a deadline for payment.
- 2. The Senior dinner will be held Saturday, May 16, at 6:00 p.m. at Kansas City Kansas Community College, Jewell Building, Lower Level.
- 3. Guest dinner tickets will cost \$25 each and must be paid for at the time your reservation is made. The Senior student's dinner ticket is paid for with the graduation fee.
- 4. Senior dinner tickets will be **sold from April 13-May 1 at 3:30 p.m. with Miss Lipovitz** in room 304. No tickets will be sold after this deadline.
- 5. You will have the opportunity to purchase two (2) or four (4) tickets. Four tickets is the limit for ALL families. Tickets will not be sold in odd amounts (for example, one (1) or three (3) tickets). If special circumstances dictate that you purchase only one (1) ticket, please contact Miss Lipovitz directly to make arrangements.
- 6. Tables will be assigned on a first come-first served basis. The earlier your money is turned in, the closer your table will be to the front of the room.
- 7. All tickets you purchase will be assigned to the same table, so families will be seated together.
- 8. Tickets will be passed out to your student(s) immediately following the Senior class Mass on Thursday, May 7.

Lost tickets will be replaced for a \$5 fee per lost ticket. A ticket is required for entry into the dinner.



Code Reminders for Outerwear and Uniform Pants in 2019-2020

From Mr. Ridley, Dean of Students: Bishop Ward Outerwear Policy

Bishop Ward students are only allowed to wear school-approved outer wear over their school uniform polo for warmth. They may wear a T-shirt under the polo but it must be white, black

or gray. The T-shirt may NOT hang out under the polo. Approved outer wear includes the 1/4 zips sold in the spirit shop with the Bishop Ward logo on the front left pocket and some of the Bishop Ward athletic/activity 1/4 zip outerwear. The athletic/activity 1/4 zip outerwear must be of solid color (black, white, or gray), no stripes, no hoods, nothing printed on the back, and must have the sport/activity logo or Bishop Ward logo on the left front pocket. Any outerwear that does not meet the above requirements may be confiscated and held by school administration until the end of the school day. Please note: if a student wears outerwear, they must also wear a uniform polo under the outerwear. If you have any questions you may contact Mr. Ridley, Dean of Students at 913-371-1201.

A reminder about skirt length: In order to maintain modesty guidelines, as found on page 35 of the Handbook, <u>the hem of the girls' skirts may not be more than 3 inches above the knee.</u> It is also important that the girls do not roll their skirts. If the skirts are more than 3 inches above the knee, girls will be asked to wear uniform slacks with the Bishop Ward logo. The pants must be approved by the front office in order to have the logo put on.

ALL students, girls & boys, will be REQUIRED to wear ONLY BWHS logoed pants that can be purchased from Lands' End for the 2019-2020 school year. Girls may continue to wear their skirt. However, if they choose to wear pants, they must be the approved BWHS logoed pants from Lands' End.

<u>Please Note: If you purchase NON-Lands' End pants, Bishop Ward has a local vendor who will sew the approved logo on the pants.</u>

IMPORTANT: If you purchase non-Lands' End pants (girls and boys) here are the guidelines:

All students, boys & girls, are REQUIRED to wear **Only BWHS logoed khaki dress slacks**. Girls may continue to wear skirts. Slacks may be purchased through Land's End. If slacks are purchased from another source, Bishop Ward has a local vendor who can sew the approved logo on the slacks. If you purchase non-Lands' End pants (girls and boys) here are the guidelines: —Girls' Slacks: Only khaki dress slacks are acceptable for girls. A maximum of four pockets (2 in front and 2 in back) are permitted. Cargo, Capri, skinny or stretch slacks are not permitted. Shorts and capri pants are not permitted for girls. —Boys' Slacks: Only khaki dress slacks are acceptable. Slacks may have a maximum of four pockets (2 in front and 2 in back). Cargo, Capri, skinny, or stretch slacks are not permitted.

—Drop off slacks at the Bishop Ward front office for approval; if slacks are approved they will be delivered to the vendor by a BWHS staff member.

Shirts for Girls & Boys: Both boys and girls must wear the black uniform polos with the school crest on the left. Only plain white, grey or black undershirts can be worn under the uniform polos. Uniform polos with the BWHS logo are also purchased through Lands' End.

Uniforms need to be dropped off in the Main Office directly to Mrs. Sanchez.

<u>Uniform drop off deadline for February is Feb. 12, 2020 at 3:30p.m..</u>

<u>Uniform drop off for March is March 25, 2020 at 3:30p.m..</u>

Pants are \$7.00 each and shirts are \$10 each. Cash or checks only.

Food Services Policy Reminder— Fast Food or Food From Any Restaurants is NOT ALLOWED

From Mr. Ridley, Dean of Students:

As found in the Handbook: Bishop Ward High School will offer breakfast and lunch programs. Bishop Ward participates in the federally sponsored Child Nutrition Program. This program is designed to assist school systems in providing nutritious lunches to all students at reasonable prices and free and reduced breakfast and lunches to those students who meet the program income guidelines. Application forms for free and reduced lunches are mailed annually to all families. All applications are to be returned to the school's designated food program application review officer. The information provided on the application is held in strictest confidence.

Bishop Ward High School operates a CLOSED LUNCH program.

Students are not permitted to leave the school campus during lunch. Students who do leave campus will be considered truant and will be referred to the Dean of Students for disciplinary action. Foods and soft drinks from restaurants such as McDonald's, Taco Bell, Pizza Hut, Subway, etc. (any fast food or food from any restaurants) are not to be ordered or brought in by students, parents or guardians or delivery persons. Students who forget lunch/money may have a parent/guardian leave lunch money or a traditional sack lunch in the front office. Note: The foods mentioned above will not be accepted and/or left in the front office.

ADMINISTRATIVE NEWS

REMINDER: SCHOOL POLICY FOR STUDENT DISMISSAL

Parents are responsible for making arrangements for their student to be picked up from school no later than 4pm. Due to liability considerations and student safety, students should not be in the building after 4pm unless they are participating in an activity that is supervised by a teacher or coach. Students in the building after 4pm will be escorted to the office and parents will be contacted.

Students Absent from School May Not Attend Practice or Evening/Weekend Activities

A reminder from Mr. Beaven, Athletic Director:

As stated in the Student Handbook, "In order to PARTICIPATE in or ATTEND an after school or evening activity, students <u>must attend school on the day of the activity for a minimum of four complete hours and may not leave school before the end of the day unless prior approval of the administration is obtained."</u> This also applies to the day before a formal dance.

Parents, PLEASE be aware of these policies and if your student is in attendance at an after-school or weekend activity, but did not fulfill the daily attendance requirement, they will be required to leave the event.

STUDENT ILLNESS POLICY

Students who feel ill and have a need to go home must <u>FIRST</u> report to the Health Office for arrangements to be made. <u>Students may not call home on a cell phone to get permission to go home.</u>

For safety, accountability, and attendance records, students MUST contact parents from the Health Office and check-out with Ms. Gregory.

STUDENT MEDICATION POLICY

The Health Office is allowed to offer students Tylenol or Advil for minor aches and pains (headaches, cramps, muscle aches, etc.) When the student takes this medication, it is recorded in the Health Office.

For prescription medication: it must be in the original container and a school form must be signed by the physician and parent with complete instructions.

Non-prescription medication (such as allergy medicine) must also be requested by the parent and doctor and arrive in the original unopened container, and a school form must be signed by the parent.

Dear Parents & Guardians,

I want to thank everyone for your attendance and support at all extra-curricular events involving Bishop Ward High School students/athletes. Bishop Ward has a strong tradition of displaying sportsmanship in the different arenas of competition. Athletics are considered an "art" and should be appreciated and enjoyed as such.

Even with intense rivalries, close games and close calls, there is NO PLACE for unsportsmanlike behavior from spectators and fans at any athletic contest that Bishop Ward competes in. We take every opportunity to remind our student body, athletes and coaches to "win with class and lose with dignity." The Kansas State High School Athletic Association regulates and enforces Citizenship/Sportmanship through Rule 52 for high school athletes and coaches.

The same POSITIVE effect on high school athletes and coaches that Rule 52 supports translates to ALL spectators and fans as well. As defined as SPORTMANSHIP through Rule 52:

"Art. 1: SPORTMANSHIP is a general way of thinking and behaving. The following sportsmanship policy items are listed below for clarification:

- a. Be courteous to all (participants, coaches, officials, staff and fans).
- b. Know the rules, abide by and respect officials and their decisions.
- c. Win with character and lose with dignity.
- d. Display appreciation for good performance regardless of the team.
- e. Exercise self-control and reflect positively upon yourself and school.
- f. Permit only positive sportsman-like behavior to reflect on your school or its activities."

Rule 52 also includes consequences the KSHSAA enforces when unacceptable and undesirable behavior is demonstrated. Suspension from games/activities is their primary consequence for athletes and coaches. It may be the case that spectators and fans are asked not to attend Bishop Ward High School athletic events if POSITIVE actions/behaviors cannot be shown.

We value and respect officials, umpires and referees. They deserve our thanks and gratitude regardless if we agree with the calls they make. Confronting, berating, or demeaning officials is unacceptable behavior from all parties involved.

To start the new 2019 year off on a positive note, let us be reminded that competition allows participants to excel, to understand, and to value positive concepts of sportsmanship. Sportsmanship builds pride, increases community involvement, and ultimately translates in what the principles of our Faith teach us.
