



POS System in Granby Public Schools will be transitioning to Heartland's Mosaic point of sale system in all cafeterias, Fall 2020. All students enrolled in the schools will be automatically set up with an account in the system.

Students are encouraged to put money on their account and charge breakfast, lunch snacks or milk to their account. They may also purchase items with cash right at the register, however cash transactions must still be rung up under the associated student profile. No "open" transactions are permitted. Each student pin is confidential, and code specific, information on students who receive free and reduced meals is also kept confidential.

Cash Handling at Middle and High Schools all daily cash is deposited into one deposit bag and dropped at the bank by one FSMC employee every day.

Cash Handling at Elementary Schools all daily cash is deposited into separate deposit bags and dropped at the bank by one FSMC employee every day.

A La Carte items are offered in addition to the reimbursable meals.

The District custodial staff is responsible for sanitation, cleaning and sweeping all areas used for food prep, food service, and storage. Food Service employees are responsible for cleaning and sanitizing all dishes, pots, pans, utensils, equipment and any similar items. The custodians will dispose of any garbage, mop the kitchen floors and food prep areas, also clean and sanitize the cafeteria where students are eating.

Vehicles- Granby Public Schools currently uses a van to deliver food daily between Middle School and High School.

Food Service Personnel - Code of Conduct

The following conduct is expected of all persons who are engaged in the award and administration of contracts supported by the Child Nutrition Program (CNP) funds. These programs include the National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, Child and Adult Care Food Program, and Summer Food Service Program.

No employee, officer or agent of the Granby Public Schools shall participate in selection or in the award or administration of a contract supported by program funds if a conflict of interest, real or apparent, would be involved. All employees, officers, and agents of The Granby Public Schools are required to adhere to Board of Education policy numbers 9270,4118.13,4218.13 which addresses conflicts of interest.

To ensure objective contractor performance and eliminate unfair competitive advantage, a person that develops or drafts specifications, requirements, statements of work, invitations, for bids, requests for proposals, contract terms and conditions of other documents for use by the child nutrition program in conducting procurement shall be excluded from competing for such procurements. Such persons are ineligible for such procurements regardless of the procurement method used.

Granby Public School employees, officers or agents shall neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, or anything of material monetary value from contractors, potential contractors or parties to sub-agreements.

The purchase during the school day of any food or service from a contractor for individual use is prohibited.

Granby Board of Education employees, officers and agents shall be governed by the following rules:

- 1. The purchase during the school day of any food or service from a contractor for individual use is prohibited.
- 2. The removal of any food, supplies, equipment or school property, such as official records, recipe books, and the like is prohibited unless express permission of the Food Service Coordinator/Business Manager/Cafeteria Supervisor has been granted.
- 3. The outside sale of such items as used oil, empty cans and the like will be sold by contract between The Granby Public Schools and the outside agency.
- 4. Individual sales by any school person to an outside agency or other school person are prohibited.

Failure of any employee to abide by this Code of Conduct could result in a fine, suspension or dismissal.

Resolution of Controversies

Any actual or proposed supplier who is aggrieved in connection with a proposed purchase may protest to the Superintendent or his/her designee.

- 1. The protest shall be in writing.
- 2. The protest shall be delivered within 10 days of the action which is being aggrieved.
- 3. A hearing will be scheduled within 15 days of receipt of protest.

- 4. The proposed purchase will be delayed until the protest is resolved unless the delay will result in disruption of meal service to children. In the event it is determined that the purchase is necessary, an emergency shall be declared by the Superintendent/Business Manager and emergency purchase procedures will be followed until protest resolution.
- 5. The decision of the hearing officer shall be in writing and shall be delivered to the aggrieve supplier with proof of delivery required.
- 6. The aggrieved supplier shall be notified that an appeal of the hearing officer's decision is possible. The appeal request should be written and addressed to the Board of Education.

Public Access to Procurement Information

- 1. Procurement information shall be a public record to the extent provided in Connecticut's Freedom of Information law.
- 2. All bid/offers shall be taken under advisement. Between the time an IFB/RFP is opened and awarded it may be viewed by any company or individual who entered a response, to the proposed intent to purchase.
 - a. Any supplier providing information, as a part of a proposal or offer shall stamp each page or sealed envelope, which they consider proprietary information, "not for public release."
 - b. Should the school district receive a request to release this marked information the supplier shall be notified within 24 hours and given 10 working days to obtain a court order to stop release.
 - c. In 10 working days the party requesting the information shall be provided a copy of the court order or instructions on when the information may be reviewed.
- 3. After acceptance, procurement information is available to the general public except as noted above.

Effective October 1, 2016, SFAs contracting with a FSMC must complete the following contract provisions if the FSMC meets the definition of a "contractor" as defined below. Hereafter contractor, operator and consultant will be referred to as the FSMC. Hereafter, local or regional board of education will be referred to as the SFA.

Section 1 - Definitions:

- (1) "Contractor" means an operator or consultant that is in possession of or has access to student information, student records or student-generated content as a result of a contract with a local or regional board of education;
- (2) "Operator" means any person who (A) operates an Internet web site, online service or mobile application with actual knowledge that such Internet web site, online service or mobile application is used for school purposes and was designed and marketed for school purposes, to the extent it is engaged in the operation of such Internet web site, online service or mobile application, and (B) collects, maintains or uses student information;
- (3) "Consultant" means a professional who provides noninstructional services, including, but not limited to, administrative, planning, analysis, statistical or research services, to a local or regional board of education pursuant to a contract with such local or regional board of education;
- (4) "Student information" means personally identifiable information or material of a student in any media or format that is not publicly available and is any of the following: (A) Created or provided by a student or the parent or legal guardian of a student, to the operator in the course of the student, parent or legal guardian using the operator's Internet web site, online service or mobile application for school purposes, (B) created or provided by an employee or agent of a local or regional board of education to an operator for school purposes, or (C) gathered by an operator through the operation of the operator's Internet web site, online service or mobile application and identifies a student, including, but not limited to, information in the student's records or electronic mail account, first or last name, home address, telephone number, date of birth, electronic mail address, discipline records, test results, grades, evaluations, criminal records, medical records, health records, Social Security number, biometric information, disabilities, socioeconomic information, food purchases, political affiliations, religious affiliations, text messages, documents, student identifiers, search activity, photographs, voice recordings, survey responses or behavioral assessments;
- (5) "Student record" means any information directly related to a student that is maintained by a local or regional board of education, the State Board of Education or the Department of Education or any information acquired from a student through the use of educational software assigned to the student by a teacher or employee of a local or regional board of education, except "student record" does not include de-identified student information allowed under the contract to be used by the contractor to (A) improve educational products for adaptive learning purposes and customize student learning, (B) demonstrate the effectiveness of the contractor's products in the marketing of such products, and (C) develop and improve the contractor's products and services;
- (6) "Student-generated content" means any student materials created by a student including, but not limited to, essays, research papers, portfolios, creative writing, music or other audio files or photographs, except "student-generated content" does not include student responses to a standardized assessment;

- (7) "Directory information" has the same meaning as provided in 34 CFR 99.3, as amended from time to time;
- (8) "School purposes" means purposes that customarily take place at the direction of a teacher or a local or regional board of education, or aid in the administration of school activities, including, but not limited to, instruction in the classroom, administrative activities and collaboration among students, school personnel or parents or legal guardians of students;
- (9) "Student" means a person who is a resident of the state and (A) enrolled in a preschool program participating in the state-wide public school information system, pursuant to section 10-10a of the general statutes, (B) enrolled in grades kindergarten to twelve, inclusive, in a public school, (C) receiving special education and related services under an individualized education program, or (D) otherwise the responsibility of a local or regional board of education:
- (10) "Targeted advertising" means presenting an advertisement to a student where the selection of the advertisement is based on student information, student records or student-generated content or inferred over time from the usage of the operator's Internet web site, online service or mobile application by such student or the retention of such student's online activities or requests over time for the purpose of targeting subsequent advertisements. "Targeted advertising" does not include any advertising to a student on an Internet web site that such student is accessing at the time or in response to a student's response or request for information or feedback;
- (11) "De-identified student information" means any student information that has been altered to prevent the identification of an individual student; and
- (12) "Persistent unique identifier" means a unique piece of information that can be used to recognize a user over time and across different Internet web sites, online services or mobile applications and is acquired as a result of the use of a student's use of an operator's Internet web site, online service or mobile application.

Section 2: Effective October 1, 2016, and applicable to contracts entered into, amended or renewed on or after this date;

- (a) (1) Student records and student-generated content are not the property of or under the control of a contractor.
 - (2) **SFA must enter below** a description of the means by which the local or regional board of education may request the deletion of student information, student records or student-generated content in the possession of the contractor.

- (3) The FSMC affirms herein that it shall not use student information, student records and student-generated content for any purposes other than those authorized pursuant to the contract.
- (4) SFA must enter below a description of the procedures by which a student, parent or legal guardian of a student may review personally identifiable information contained in student information, student records or student-generated content and correct erroneous information, if any, in such student record;

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- (5) The FSMC shall take actions designed to ensure the security and confidentiality of student information, student records and student-generated content.
- (6) **The FSMC must enter below** a description of the procedures that the FSMC will follow to notify the local or regional board of education when there has been an unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition of student information, student records or student-generated content.

(7) Student information, student records or student-generated content shall not be retained or available to the FSMC upon completion of the contracted services unless a student, parent or legal guardian of a student chooses to establish or maintain an electronic account with the FSMC for the purpose of storing student-generated content.

- (8) The FSMC and the local or regional board of education shall ensure compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 USC 1232g, as amended from time to time.
- (9) The laws of the state of Connecticut shall govern the rights and duties of the FSMC and the SFA.
- (10) If any provision of the contract or the application of the contract is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of the contract which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.
- (b) All student-generated content shall be the property of the student or the parent or legal guardian of the student.
- (c) The FSMC shall implement and maintain security procedures and practices designed to protect student information, student records and student-generated content from unauthorized access, destruction, use, modification or disclosure that, based on the sensitivity of the data and the risk from unauthorized access, (1) use technologies and methodologies that are consistent with the guidance issued pursuant to section 13402(h)(2) of Public Law 111-5, as amended from time to time, (2) maintain technical safeguards as it relates to the possession of student records in a manner consistent with the provisions of 45 CFR 164.312, as amended from time to time, and (3) otherwise meet or exceed industry standards.
- (d) The FSMC shall not use (1) student information, student records or student-generated content for any purposes other than those authorized pursuant to the contract, or (2) personally identifiable information contained in student information, student records or student-generated content to engage in targeted advertising.

(e) Any provision of a contract entered into between the FSMC and SFA that conflicts with any provision of this section shall be void.

Section 3 [Applicable if the FSMC meets the definition of "operator" in Section 1 above.]

- (a) The FSMC shall
 - (1) implement and maintain security procedures and practices that meet or exceed industry standards and that are designed to protect student information, student records and student-generated content from unauthorized access, destruction, use, modification or disclosure, and
 - (2) delete any student information, student records or student- generated content within a reasonable amount of time if a student, parent or legal guardian of a student or local or regional board of education who has the right to control such student information requests the deletion of such student information, student records or student-generated content.
- (b) The FSMC shall not knowingly:
 - (1) Engage in (A) targeted advertising on the operator's Internet web site, online service or mobile application, or (B) targeted advertising on any other Internet web site, online service or mobile application if such advertising is based on any student information, student records, student-generated content or persistent unique identifiers that the operator has acquired because of the use of the FSMC's Internet web site, online service or mobile application for school purposes;
 - (2) Collect, store and use student information, student records, student-generated content or persistent unique identifiers for purposes other than the furtherance of school purposes;
 - (3) Sell, rent or trade student information, student records or student-generated content unless the sale is part of the purchase, merger or acquisition of a FSMC by a successor FSMC and the FSMC and successor FSMC continue to be subject to the provisions of this section regarding student information; or
 - Disclose student information, student records or student-generated content unless the disclosure is made (A) in furtherance of school purposes of the Internet web site, online service or mobile application, provided the recipient of the student information uses such student information to improve the operability and functionality of the Internet web site, online service or mobile application and complies with subsection (a) of this section; (B) to ensure compliance with federal or state law or regulations or pursuant to a court order; (C) in response to a judicial order; (D) to protect the safety or integrity of users or others, or the security of the Internet web site, online service or mobile application; (E) to an entity hired by the FSMC to provide services for the FSMC's Internet web site, online service or mobile application, provided the FSMC contractually (i) prohibits the entity from using student information, student records or student-generated content for any purpose other than providing the contracted service to, or on behalf of, the FSMC, (ii) prohibits the entity from disclosing student information, student records or student-generated content provided by the operator to subsequent third parties, and (iii) requires the entity to comply with subsection (a) of this section; or (F) for a school purpose or other educational or employment purpose requested by a student or the parent or legal guardian of a student. provided such student information is not used or disclosed for any other purpose.
- (c) The FSMC may use student information (1) to maintain, support, improve, evaluate or diagnose the operator's Internet web site, online service or mobile application, (2) for adaptive learning purposes or customized student learning, (3) to provide recommendation engines to recommend content or services relating to school purposes or other educational or employment purposes, provided such recommendation is not determined in whole or in part by payment or other consideration from a third party, or (4) to respond to a request for information or feedback from a student, provided such response is not determined in whole or in part by payment or other consideration from a third party.
- (d) The FSMC may use de-identified student information or aggregated student information (1) to develop or improve the FSMC's Internet web site, online service or mobile

- application, or other Internet web sites, online services or mobile applications owned by the operator, or (2) to demonstrate or market the effectiveness of the FSMC's Internet web site, online service or mobile application.
- (e) The FSMC may share aggregated student information or de- identified student information for the improvement and development of Internet web sites, online services or mobile applications designed for school purposes.

Section 4: [Applicable if the FSMC meets the definitions of "contractor" and "operator" as defined in Section 1 above.]

- (a) Unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition of student information.
 - (1) Upon the discovery of a breach of security that results in the unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition of student information, excluding any directory information contained in such student information, the FSMC shall notify, without unreasonable delay, but not more than thirty days after such discovery, the local or regional board of education of such breach of security. During such thirty-day period, the FSMC may (A) conduct an investigation to determine the nature and scope of such unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition, and the identity of the students whose student information is involved in such unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition, or (B) restore the reasonable integrity of the FSMC's data system.
 - (2) Upon the discovery of a breach of security that results in the unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition of directory information, student records or student-generated content, the FSMC shall notify, without unreasonable delay, but not more than sixty days after such discovery, the local or regional board of education of such breach of security. During such sixty-day period, the FSMC may (A) conduct an investigation to determine the nature and scope of such unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition, and the identity of the students whose directory information, student records or student-generated content is involved in such unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition, or (B) restore the reasonable integrity of the contractor's data system.
 - (3) Upon receipt of notice of a breach of security under subdivisions (1) or (2) of this subsection, a local or regional board of education shall electronically notify, not later than forty-eight hours after receipt of such notice, the student and the parents or guardians of the student whose student information, student records or student-generated content is involved in such breach of security. The local or regional board of education shall post such notice on the board's Internet web site.
- Upon the discovery of a breach of security that results in the unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition of student information, student records or student-generated content, the FSMC that is in possession of or maintains student information, student records or student-generated content as a result of a student's use of such FSMC's Internet web site, online service or mobile application, shall (1) notify, without unreasonable delay, but not more than thirty days after such discovery, the student or the parents or guardians of such student of any breach of security that results in the unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition of student information, excluding any directory information contained in such student information, of such student, and (2) notify, without unreasonable delay, but not more than sixty days after such discovery, the student or the parents or quardians of such student of any breach of security that results in the unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition of directory information, student records or student-generated content of such student. During such thirty-day or sixty-day period, the FSMC may (A) conduct an investigation to determine the nature and scope of such unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition, and the identity of the students whose student information, student records or student-generated content are involved in such unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition, or (B) restore the reasonable integrity of the FSMC's data system.

The Board of Education (Board) may, pursuant to this policy, enter into a contract with a third party for either or both of the following purposes:

- 1. To provide services, including cloudbased services, for the digital storage, management, and retrieval of student records.
- 2. To provide digital educational software that authorizes a thirdparty provider of digital educational software to access, store, and use student records in accordance with the contractual provisions listed below.

The Board, on or after October 1, 2016, when entering into a contract with a contractor for purposes listed above, shall ensure the contract includes, but is not limited to the following:

- 1. A statement that student records, student information and student generated content continues to be the property of and under the control of the Board. (They are not the property of, or under the control of a software or electronic service contractor.
- 2. A description of the means by which the Board, students, their parents or legal guardians, may retain possession and control of studentgenerated content, and if applicable, means by which a student, parent or legal guardian of a student may transfer studentgenerated content to an electronic mail account.
- 3. A statement that the contractor will not use student information, student records, or studentgenerated content for any purposes except those the contract authorizes.
- 4. A description of the procedures by which a student, parent or legal guardian, of a student may review personally identifiable information (PII) contained in the student's record, student information or student-generated content and correct erroneous information, if any in such student material.
- 5. A statement that the contractor shall take actions designed to ensure the security and confidentiality of student records, student information, and studentgenerated content.
- 6. A description of the procedures that a contractor will follow for notifying a student, the parent or legal guardian of a student, parent, legal guardian of a student, and the Board, as soon as practical, but not later than fortyeight (48) hours after the contractor becomes aware of or suspects that any student record, student information, or studentgenerated content under the contractor's control has been subject to unauthorized access or suspected unauthorized access.
- 7. A statement that a student's records, student information, or studentgenerated content shall not be retained or available to the contractor upon completion of the contracted services unless a student, parent or legal guardian of a student chooses to establish or maintain an electronic account with the contractor for the purpose of storing studentgenerated content.
- 8. A statement that the contractor and the Board shall ensure compliance with the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), 20 USC 1232g.
- 9. A statement that Connecticut laws shall govern the rights and duties of the contractor and the Board.

- 10. A statement that if any provision of the contract or the application of the contract is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other provisions of the contract which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.
- 11. A prohibition against the contractor using personally identifiable information contained in student records to engage in advertising or for any other purposes other than those authorized pursuant to the contract.

Any provision of a contract entered into between a contractor and the Board on or after October 1, 2016, that conflicts with the provisions listed above shall be void.

Any contract entered into on and after October 1, 2016, that does not include the provisions listed above shall be void, provided the Board has given reasonable notice to the contractor and the contractor has failed within a reasonable time to amend the contract to include the required provisions.

Not later than five business days after executing a contract pursuant to this policy, the Board shall provide electronic notice to any student and the parent or legal guardian of a student affected by the contract. The notice shall (1) state that the contract has been executed and the date that such contract was executed, (2) provide a brief description of the contract and the purpose of the contract, and (3) state what student information, student records or studentgenerated content may be collected as a result of the contract. The Board shall post such notice and the contract on the Board's Internet website.

The Board expects that an operator shall implement and maintain reasonable security procedures and practices, in accordance with current industry standards to protect student information from unauthorized access, destruction use, modification and disclosure? and to delete any student information if a student or his/her parent/legal guardian or the Board requests the deletion of such student information.

Notice of Breach of Security/Data Breacher

Upon notice of a breach of security by a contractor, the Board shall, within fortyeight (48) hours notify the students and the parents/legal guardians of the students whose student information, student records, or student-generated content was involved in such breach. The Board shall also, as required, post notice of the breach on its website.

Upon the discovery of a breach of security that results in the unauthorized release of student information, excluding directory information, the contract shall contain the provision that the contractor must notify the Board of such breach without unreasonable delay, and in no case later than thirty (30) days from the discovery of the breach.

Upon the discovery of a breach of security that results in the unauthorized release of directory information, student records, or studentgenerated content, the contract shall contain the provision that the contractor must notify the Board without unreasonable delay and in no case later than sixty (60) days from the discovery of the breach.

Note: The Board may desire to contract for more prompt notice of a breach of security.

Definitions

- 1. "Contractor" means an operator or consultant that is in possession of or has access to student information, student records or studentgenerated content as a result of a contract with a local or regional Board of Education.
- 2. "Operator" means the operator of an Internet website, online service, online application, or mobile application with actual knowledge that such Internet website, service, or mobile application is used primarily

for school purposes and was designed and marketed for school purposes and who collects, maintains or uses student information.

- 3. "Student" means a Connecticut resident enrolled in a preschool program participating in the statewide public school information system, pursuant to section 1010a of the general statutes, or enrolled in grades K to 12, inclusive, in a public school, or receiving special education and related services under an individualized education program, or otherwise the responsibility of the Board.
- 4. "De-identified information" means any information that has been altered to prevent the identification of an individual student.
- 5. "Eligible student" means a student who has reached 18 years of age.
- 6. "Studentgenerated content" means materials created by a student, including, but not limited to, essays, research reports, portfolios, creative writing, music or other audio files, or photographs. "Studentgenerated content" does not include student responses to a standardized assessment.
- 7. "Student records" means any information directly related to a student that is maintained by the school district, the State Board of Education or the Department of Education or any information acquired from a student through the use of educational software assigned to the student by a teacher or other district employee.

"Student records" does not mean any of the following:

- a. De-identified information, allowed under the contract to be used by the contractor to improve educational products for adaptive learning purposes and for customizing student learning.
- b. De-identified information, used to demonstrate the effectiveness of the contractor's products in the marketing of such products.
- c. De-identified information, used for the development and improvement of the contractor's products and services.
- 8. "Online service" includes Cloud computing services, which must comply with this policy if they otherwise meet the definition of an operator.
- 9. "Student information" means personally identifiable information regarding a student that in any media or format that meets any of the following:
 - a) Is created or provided by a student, or the student's parent or legal guardian, to the operator in the course of the students', parents', or legal guardians' use of the operators' website, online service, or mobile application for school purposes.
 - b) Is created or provided by an employee or agent of the school, school district, local education agency, to an operator for school purposes.
 - c) Is gathered by an operator through the operation of the operator's Internet website, online service, or mobile application and identifies a student including but not limited to information in the student's educational record or email account, first and last name, home address, telephone number, email address, or other information that allows physical or online contact, discipline records, test results, special education data, juvenile dependency records, grades, evaluations, criminal records, medical records, health records, social security number, biometric information, disabilities, socioeconomic information, food purchases, political affiliations, religious information, text messages, documents, student identifiers, search activity, photos, voice recordings, or geolocation information.

- 10. "School purposes" means purposes that customarily take place at the direction of a teacher, or school district or aid in the administration of school activities, including, but not limited to, instruction in the classroom, administrative activities, and collaboration among students, school personnel, or parents/legal guardians. The Board, through this policy, places restrictions on an "operator" as defined in this policy. An operator shall not knowingly engage in any of the following activities with respect to their site, service, or application.
- 11. "Targeted advertising" means presenting an advertisement to a student where the selection of the advertisement is based on student information, or inferred from the usage of the operator's Internet website, online service or mobile application by such student.

The Board, through this policy, places restrictions on an "operator" as defined in this policy. An operator shall not knowingly engage in any of the following activities with respect to their internet website, online service or mobile application:

- 1. Engage in targeted advertising on the operator's site, service, or application, or on any other Internet website, online service or mobile application?
- 2. Use student information to create a profile of a student for purposes other than the furtherance of school purposes?
- 3. Sell student information, unless the sale is part of the purchase, merger, or acquisition of an operator by a successor operator and the operator and the successor operator continue to be subject to the provisions of this policy regarding student information? or
- 4. Disclose student information, unless the disclosure is made (a) in furtherance of school purposes of the Internet website, online service or mobile application, provided the recipient of the student information uses such student information to improve the operability and functionality of the Internet website, online service or mobile application and complies with this policy? (b) to ensure compliance with federal or state law? (c) in response to a judicial order? (d) to protect the safety of users or others, or the security of the Internet website, online service or mobile application? or (e) to an entity hired by the operator to provide services for the operator's Internet website, online service or mobile application, provided the operator contractually (i) prohibits the entity from using student information for any purpose other than providing the contracted service to, or on behalf of, the operator, (ii) prohibits the entity from disclosing student information provided by the operator to subsequent third parties, and (iii) requires the entity to comply with this policy.

The Board recognizes that an operator may:

- 1. Use student information (1) to maintain, support, evaluate or diagnose the operator's Internet website, online service or mobile application, or (2) for adaptive learning purposes or customized student learning.
- 2. Use deidentified student information (1) to develop or improve the operator's Internet website, online service or mobile application, or other Internet websites, online services or mobile applications owned by the operator, or (2) to demonstrate or market the effectiveness of the operator's Internet website, online service or mobile application.
- 3. Share aggregated deidentified student information for the improvement and development of Internet websites, online services or mobile applications designed for school purposes.

Nothing in this policy shall be construed to:

1. Limit the ability of a law enforcement agency to obtain student information from an operator as authorized by law or pursuant to a court order?

NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS UNDER FERPA

GRANBY PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Granby, Connecticut

Dear Parent or Student:

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. They are:

- 1. The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the district receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal (or appropriate school official) a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.
- 2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading.

Parents or eligible students may ask the school district to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the school principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading.

If the district decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the district will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

3. The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

One exception which permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the district as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel).

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

Upon request, the district discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll. (Note: FERPA requires a school district to make a reasonable attempt to notify the student of the records request unless it states in its annual notification that it intends to forward records on request.)

4. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the district to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA is:

Nutrition Program

The Superintendent or his designee shall prepare and implement a comprehensive District nutrition program consistent with state and federal requirements as detailed in the "Nutritional Standards in National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs", for districts sponsoring the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and/or the School Breakfast Program (SBP). The input of staff, students, parents and public health professionals will be encouraged.

The program shall provide adequate time for instruction to promote healthy eating through nutrition education, serving healthy, nutritious, and appealing foods at District schools, developing food-use guidelines for staff and establishing liaisons with nutrition service providers, as appropriate. Nutrition education topics shall be integrated within the sequential, comprehensive health education program taught at every grade level, pre-kindergarten through grade 12, and coordinated with the District's nutrition and food services operation.

Meals served by the school nutrition and food services operations shall meet the nutrition standards required by the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 and meet the CSDE Healthy Snack Program for a la carte foods as well as other guidelines that may be recommended by District and school health and nutrition committees

Food sold or served in District schools shall include affordable nutritious meals mainly created from scratch, using whole ingredients with minimally added sugar, and sodium, locally sourced produce when available and zero trans-fat foods which shall include, but shall not be limited to, low-fat dairy products, and fresh or dried fruit at all times when food is available for purchase by students during the school day. All milk offered shall be low-fat (1%) or fat-free.

The sale of beverages to students during the school day from any source, including, but not limited to, school stores, vending machines, school cafeterias and any fund-raising activities on school grounds, whether or not school-sponsored, shall be restricted to milk, non-dairy drinks such as soy or rice milk, 100% fruit juices, vegetable juices or combination of such juices, beverages that contain only water or vegetable juice and water. All allowed beverages must fulfill the requirements specified in Connecticut statute regarding artificial sweeteners, flavoring, caffeine and portion size.

The Superintendent is directed to develop administrative regulations to implement this policy, including such provisions as may be necessary to address all food and beverages sold and/or served to students at school (i.e., competitive foods, snacks and beverages sold from vending machines, school stores, and fund-raising activities and refreshments that are made available at school parties, celebrations and meetings), including provisions for staff development, family and community involvement and program evaluation.

Farm-to-School Program

Any bid submitted by a service management company in response to a request for proposal (RFP) or bid solicitation by the Board that is posted to the State Portal and that relates to the Board's school nutrition program shall include information detailing the consistency of such bid with the State's Farm to School Program and the ways in which such bid facilitates the purchase of products from local farmers by the Board. The Board shall give preference to the RFP or bid that promotes the purchase of local farm products while remaining within federal and state guidelines.

The Superintendent of Schools or his/her designee shall establish such administrative procedures to control food sales, which compete with the District's food service in compliance with federal statutes and regulations. Schools will not offer or sell other non-cafeteria/competitive foods to students on campus during established meal periods in schools participating in the National School Lunch Program.

The Food Service Program shall restrict the sale of foods of minimal nutritional value as defined by the U.S. Department of Agriculture in the food service areas during meal periods.

Food Sales Other than National School Lunch Program

No food or drinks which do not meet the minimal nutritional values set by the Food and Nutrition Service of the United States Department of Agriculture (Section 17 of Public Law 95-166 amending Section 10 of the Child Nutrition Act of 1966) may be sold or made available for sale in any school of the district in the food service area during established meal periods.

The Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture has approved a list of competitive foods which may be sold, and the State of Connecticut may extend that list, but only foods approved by the State of Connecticut and/or the Secretary may be sold in the schools of the district during the hours cited.

The listing of categories of goods of less than minimal nutritional value shall be used as a guide to sales of competitive foods and drinks in the schools, with the understanding that the listing may be modified by the USDA and/or the State of Connecticut.

Categories of Food of Minimal Nutritional Value:

- 1. Soda Water: As defined by 21 CFR 165.175 FDA regulations except that artificial sweeteners are an ingredient that is included in this definition.
- 2. Water Ices: As defined by 21 CFR 135.160 FDA regulations except that water ices which contain fruit or fruit juices are not included in this definition.
- 3. Chewing Gum: Flavored products from natural or synthetic gums and other ingredients which form an insoluble mass for chewing.
- 4. Certain Candies: Processed foods made predominantly from sweeteners with a variety of minor ingredients which characterize the following types:
 - a. Hard candy such as sour balls, fruit balls, candy sticks, lollipops, starlight mints, after dinner mints, sugar wafers, rock candy, cinnamon candies, breath mints, jaw breakers and cough drops.
 - b. Jellies and gums, such as gum drops, jelly beans, jellied and fruit-flavored slices.

- c. Marshmallow candies.
- d. Fondant, such as candy corn, soft mints.
- e. Licorice a product made mostly from sugar and corn syrup which is flavored with an extract made from the licorice root.
- f. Spun candy.
- g. Candy coated popcorn, a product made by coating popcorn with a mixture made predominantly from sugar and corn syrup.

Instruction

Student Nutrition and Physical Activity (Student Wellness)

Purpose and Goal

The Granby Public Schools promotes healthy schools by supporting wellness, good nutrition, and regular physical activity as part of the total learning environment. All students shall possess the knowledge and skills necessary to make nutritious and enjoyable food choices for a lifetime. In addition, staff are encouraged to model healthy eating and physical activity as a valuable part of daily life. The District shall prepare, adopt, and implement a comprehensive plan to encourage healthy eating and physical activity. This plan shall make effective use of school and community resources and equitably serve the needs and interests of all students and staff. Therefore, it is the policy of the Board to:

- A. Provide students access to nutritious food;
- B. Provide opportunities for physical activity and developmentally appropriate exercise; and
- C. Provide accurate information related to these topics

Access to Nutritious Foods

The District shall develop and implement a comprehensive district-wide nutrition program consistent with state and federal requirements for districts sponsoring the National School Lunch Program and/or School Breakfast Program and with Section 204 of the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010.

Nutritious meals served by the food services operation and other nutritious food choices served in district schools and district sponsored events will comply with district guidelines and state and federal law.

Goals for Nutrition Education

The goals for addressing nutrition education include the following:

- Schools will promote good nutrition for students consistent with applicable federal and state requirements and guidelines.
- Schools will take a proactive effort to foster the positive relationship between good nutrition, physical activity, and the capacity of students to develop and learn.
- Nutrition education will be taught in all grades K-8 and at the high school as part of the District's comprehensive school health education curriculum and will be integrated into other classroom content areas, as appropriate.

Goals for Physical Activity

The goals for addressing physical activity include the following:

- Schools will promote an active lifestyle for students.
- Physical education will be taught in all grades and shall include a standards-based, developmentally planned and sequential curriculum that fosters the development of movement skills, enhances health-related fitness, increases students' knowledge, offers direct opportunities to learn how to work cooperatively in a

group setting, and encourages healthy habits and attitudes for a healthy lifestyle. Physical activity will be integrated into other classroom content areas as appropriate.

• Unless otherwise exempted, all students will be required to engage in the District's physical education program.

Nutrition Guidelines for Foods Available in Schools

All sources of food sales to students at school must comply with the Connecticut Nutrition Standards. The District shall ensure that all beverages sold to students comply with the requirements of state statute. The District shall ensure compliance with allowable time frames for the sale of competitive foods as specified by state law.

Reimbursable School Meals

Reimbursable school meals served shall meet, at a minimum, the nutrition requirements and regulations for the National School Lunch Program and/or School Breakfast Program.

Communication and Marketing

Students, parents, teachers, administrators and the community will receive positive and motivating messages about healthy eating and physical activity within school and at school sponsored events.

Implementation

A district wide wellness committee (The Nutrition and Physical Activity Advisory Council) comprised of school administration, parents, and students shall monitor the implementation of the District's wellness plan and its nutrition and physical activity components, evaluating progress, serving as a resource, and recommending revisions to Superintendent or his/her designee.

- (1) The School Food Service will inform students when they have begun charging.
- (2) After the 3rd charge, the parents will be contacted by food services. In addition account low balance notices will be sent out on a weekly basis. Students should bring in a bag lunch until the balance is paid in full.

Middle School students, grades 6 thru 8: will be allowed to charge only one (1) reimbursable meal. No a la carte items are to be charged.

(1) After the 1st charge, until the balance is paid in full, the student should bring in a bag lunch or the student will receive an alternate meal consisting of a cheese sandwich, milk & fruit for \$1.00. Parents will be notified by food services.

High School Students, grades 9 thru 12: Charging is not allowed.
