Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2018-2019 educational progress for the Columbia Central Jr./Sr. High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2018-19 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified as a HAS NOT BEEN GIVEN ONE OF THESE LABELS.

Columbia Central Jr./Sr. High School works on improvement strategies within our School Improvement Framework. Some key challenges include proficiency levels of our lowest performing students. We want them to be successful. In order to help students demonstrate growth with their learning targets, we are using interventions such as strategies to help students complete multi step problems successfully and

to increase their educational stamina while incorporating cooperative learning structures. While we are in the implementation stage of cooperative learning, we have new staff members who are currently learning these strategies.

 Students are assigned here based on geographical location and School of Choice.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

• We are progress monitoring Cooperative Learning Structures. We are in the third year of implementation. In addition to our work with Cooperative Learning, we have integrated success strategies for our students to practice solving multi step problems and to increase their educational stamina. We are in the beginning stages of this model. We have new staff members this school year who need additional training with cooperative learning and multi step problem solving. In addition, we have incorporated an attendance strategy hoping to increase the amount of time students are in school. We are monitoring this strategy. We complete the Program Evaluation Tool every year as a School Improvement Team to continue to evaluate best practice

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

- Columbia Central Jr./Sr. High School had 654 students in grades 7 through 12th in 2018-2019. Our student count was up by 30 last school year. Our rural community offers families the opportunity to participate in positive learning activities with their children. Our school offers a variety of advanced placement classes in addition to extracurricular activities. In 2018-19, Columbia Central High School was named a Best High School by US News & World Report and we also earned a College Success Award.
- 4. IDENTIFY HOW TO ACCESS A COPY OF THE CORE CURRICULUM, A DESCRIPTION OF ITS IMPLEMENTATION, AND AN EXPLANATION OF THE VARIANCES FROM THE STATE'S MODEL
 - Columbia Central Jr./Sr. High School follows Michigan Core Standards.

 https://www.myeagles.org/o/columbia-central-sr-high-school/page/academics--372. The teaching staff has developed learning targets from

the Core Standards that focus on their course content. Advanced Placement courses need their learning targets approved by College Board to qualify as AP.

- 5. THE AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS FOR ANY LOCAL COMPETENCY TESTS OR NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS
 - Columbia Central Jr./Sr. High School scored above the state average on the Spring 2019, SAT. We scored above the state average in Math and just below in Reading and Writing. In addition, on the PSAT 10, we scored below the state average in Math, Reading, and Writing. On the PSAT 8/9, our 9th grade students scored above the state average and 8th grade scored just below. We will continue to work on our progress with a goal of exceeding the state average in both Reading, Writing, and Math. In 2017-2018, Columbia Central scored just below the state average on the Spring 2018, SAT. We scored above the state average in Math and just below in Reading and Writing. In addition, on the PSAT 10, we scored just above the state average in Math. In 2016-2017, Columbia Central Jr./Sr. High School scored above the state average on the SAT in the Spring. In addition, our high school was ranked the top achieving high school on the SAT in Jackson County in 2016-2017.
- 6. IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES
 - In the 2018-2019 school year, we had 211, 31%, of students represented by a parent(s) at our Fall Conferences. Over the past two years in 2016-2017 and 2017-2018, we held Parent Teacher Conferences in the Fall of 2017 and the Spring of 2018 for students in grades 7-12. We had an average of 30-40% attend.
- 7. FOR HIGH SCHOOLS, ONLY ALSO REPORT ON THE FOLLOWING:
 - a. THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF POSTSECONDARY ENROLLMENTS (DUAL ENROLLMENT) In 2018-2019, we had 39 students, 20%, enrolled in 78 classes for Dual Enrollment. In 2017-2018, we had 8 students including 22 classes participating in Dual Enrollment. In 2016-17, we had 14 students in 16 courses.
 - b. **THE NUMBER OF COLLEGE EQUIVALENT COURSES OFFERED** (**AP/IB**) We offered 4 advanced placement classes in 2018-2019. In these classes, 45 students, 23%, were enrolled. We offered a total of 7 advanced placement courses throughout the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 school year.

- c. THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS ENROLLED IN COLLEGE EQUIVALENT COURSES (AP/IB) We had 45 students, 23%, enrolled in college equivalent courses in 2018-2019. In 2017-2018 we had 113 enrolled in AP courses and 104 in the 2016-2017 school year.
- d. THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS RECEIVING A SCORE LEADING TO COLLEGE CREDIT In 2018-2019, out of 29 assessments taken, 22, 75%, led to college credit. In 2016-2017, approximately 42 students received a score on the Advanced Placement assessment leading to college credit. In 2017-2018, this average was similar with approximately 41 students earning college credit.

Congratulations to the staff at Columbia Central Jr./Sr. High School. Our teaching and learning environment promotes student achievement and an overall positive school culture. Parents and community members work in partnership with our school district to help promote lifelong learners and access to opportunities outside of the school. We are so grateful for this partnership. In closing, Columbia Central Jr./Sr. High School strives to create a supportive and encouraging atmosphere to recognize individuals for their efforts and accomplishments.
