

Message from Mr. Fee


Easton Valley CSD was thrilled to commence the new year with the opening of the new junior high and high school addition. Staff and students have moved into the new science laboratory, agriculture classroom, and workshop. Students are already reporting new learning experiences as a result of the new vent hood and updated equipment. Excitement is also growing among students who have enrolled in our small engines and Ag construction classes that we are now able to host in our new space.

The construction in our elementary school is also progressing according to schedule. A majority of the work should conclude by mid-July allowing us plenty of time to get settled in before the start of the 2020-2021 school year. The new addition on the building is now completely enclosed, the floor is poured, and a majority of the framing and block walls have been constructed in the interior of the school.

With all of the new spaces framed out, anyone touring the school can begin to appreciate the flow and organization of the new layout. For instance, after entering the school you will be welcomed into a beautiful new shared space that includes our cafeteria/commons area and school library. The commons area is accentuated with a sloped, elevated ceiling leading to several large south-facing windows to bring in an abundance of natural light. This large space will accommodate nearly 200 students at one time.



In addition to the upper elementary wing of the school that we renovated a few years ago, our lower elementary will now have their own wing of this school. This section includes two preschool and two kindergarten classrooms that will open up directly to their new fenced-in playground area. These rooms also have their own restrooms and corridor areas for storing bookbags, coats, boots, and more. Across the hall, in our lower elementary wing, you will find our 1st-grade through 3rd-grade classrooms. These beautiful new spaces will feature an interior door that connects the classrooms in each grade so that students can easily transition between rooms for different groups and activities.

As guests enter our school they will be welcomed into a brand new office space that includes new offices for our principal and nurse. Behind our office manager's reception area will also be a large conference room to hold a variety of meetings inside. Across from the office in our entry area, our staff will enjoy a spacious workroom and lunch area. Adjacent to this space visitors will see our newly renovated south wing that connects nicely off of our commons and entry area. It will house a number of specialty program areas such as Talented and Gifted, Special Education, Title 1 Services, and more.

Finally, on the opposite end of the school near our gym, students will access their specials classrooms such as art, music, and physical education. Students will love the spacious art room that includes plenty of space to store projects. The art room also has its own kiln room that will allow our students' new learning experiences as they explore clay and design different types of projects that they can bring home to share with their family. Up the ramp from our art room students will access our new music learning space, which will include a bumped out wall for risers, a separate instructional space, and storage for many different instruments. Another exciting feature includes a doorway that opens directly to the back of the stage.



In addition to all the exciting features that our students and staff will enjoy, we are so excited about the beautiful new look of our school. Easton Valley families and visitors to our community will now find an updated, vibrant school that will serve not only our elementary students but many of our high school athletics as well. We are so grateful for the support we have received from the Easton Valley Community to make this possible. We cannot wait to share this beautiful new school with you!

We built it, so now what?

On January 7th at 3 o'clock Easton Valley Community School District hosted a grand opening for the new addition to the junior high/high school building. The addition included a new Science classroom with new lab stations, a new Ag classroom and new Ag shop area. So now what? Were these rooms built just for simple upgrades or was there a purpose? As many of you know this type of addition to any building takes much planning and time. As a part of that planning the school community tried to address the needs of the building and these were the areas that rose to the top.

Our new Science room consists of five new up-to-date lab stations. Our students have already begun seeing the rewards of the new equipment. One class has been working on the creation of biodiesel. With the extra space in the room, it also allows for more dissection of animals and many more hands-on activities that were difficult to do in the old classroom setting.

The new Ag classroom is an actual classroom and not a modified room which the students have been using for many years. The set up of having a ceiling allows for less distraction with noise or lack of heat. Our students are also enjoying the opportunity of having the advance animal Science class as a college level course being taught in our new facility. Our new Ag shop opens the door for many new possibilities as well. A class involving diesel engines or welding are areas where our students may find new programming for next fall. The new space provides opportunities for many options in the future.

No matter where our students' paths take them our goal will remain the same as our mission, EVery student, EVery day.

CONCUSSION FORMS

PLEASE READ THIS IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Reminder to ALL students/parents of the Iowa Code pertaining to concussions. All students in grades 7-12 who participate in extracurricular activities **MUST** read and complete the **HEADS UP - Concussion in High School Sports** form annually. Athletes must also complete an annual sports physical. Both of these forms can be found in the high school office.


The Iowa Legislature passed a new law, effective July 1, 2011, regarding students in grades 7 - 12 who participate in extracurricular interscholastic activities. Please note this important information from Iowa Code Section 280.13C, Brain Injury Policies:

- (1) A child must be immediately removed from participation (practice and competition) if his/her coach or a contest official observes signs, symptoms, or behaviors consistent with a concussion or brain injury in an extracurricular interscholastic activity.
- (2) A child may not participate again until a licensed health care provider trained in the evaluation and management of concussions and brain injuries has evaluated him/her and the student has received written clearance from that person to return to participation.





As you can see from the above chart, Influenza A & B symptoms usually present the same. Many of the symptoms are similar to a cold. There are medications that can help if you have influenza, however, most need to be started with in 48 hours of onset. Your doctor can test you for the flu. PLEASE, if you are sick, STAY HOME!

The number one way to prevent the spread of illness is to wash your hands!!!



NUTRITION

FREE AND REDUCED MEALS

Easton Valley Community Schools provides all students an Iowa Eligibility Application which is mailed out to their homes during the summer. Families who may qualify for free and reduced meals for the upcoming school year, are encouraged to complete the form when they receive it in the mail. Families who are directly certified through the state, will receive a direct certification letter and do not need to complete the Iowa Eligibility Application.

Families may apply for the meal benefits any time during the school year. Free and reduced meal eligibility is strictly confidential.

Families who qualify for free meals, must have money in their account for any extra and a la carte items the students may purchase that is in addition to the regular main breakfast and lunch. Families who qualify for reduced meals, must have money in their account to cover the reduced price meals costs, and any extras and a la carte items.

Applications may be mailed back to the school, or returned at registration. They will be processed within 3 business days and families will receive a mailed response as to the status of their application. For more information, please contact Sharon Jargo at (563) 689-3431 Ext 2110.

Fee Waiver

If your child(ren) qualify for free and reduced price meals, they may also be eligible for other benefits. Complete the waiver form that is attached to the application and return it at the same time.

Food Allergies

If your child(ren) has a food allergy and you would like the school to make a modification for him/her, you must have a Diet Modification form filled out and signed by your child's physician and returned to the school. For more information, please contact any of the school nurses.

Meal Requirements

Schools across the United States offer meals to students that meet the reimbursement guidelines from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). School meals are priced as a unit, and we receive federal and state reimbursement to offset our costs.

To get the most for your money, encourage your child(ren) to purchase a complete meal.

For breakfast, students may choose

- ◆ 1 serving Milk (1/2 pint fluid milk)
- ◆ 1 serving 4 oz. fruit juice OR fruit
- ◆ 1 or 2 servings Grain, meat/meat alternate (which includes the dairy entrée)

If students choose at least 3 components (milk, fruit, grain, and/or meal/meat alternate), their breakfast will be at the reimbursable meal rate. This applies for Free and Reduced requirements as well. If they only choose 2 components, we must charge for each item separately as the selections would not meet the USDA's requirements for a complete reimbursable meal.

For lunch, students may choose


