Dear Guidance Counselor:

The Board of Trustees and Director of the Gerald J. Mullin Scholarship Foundation are pleased to announce a new scholarship in honor of Mr. Mullin. He was a coach, teacher, and principal for 32 years and he also provided employment for high school and college students for 33 years.

Scholarship Eligibility Requirements:

1. To be eligible for the scholarship applicant must:
 - a. have been an employee of Mr. Mullin (or the direct descendant of an employee) while he ran Mullin's Drive-In in Fox Lake, WI; or
 - b. have been a student or athlete of Mr. Mullin (or the direct descendant of a student or athlete) while he was coaching, teaching and principal for the Westfield School District in Oxford, WI.
2. Applicant shall be a high school senior or current student in good standing at a Trade School, Technical College, Community College, or four-year College or University.
3. Applicant shall have a minimum of a 3.0 GPA and this GPA must be maintained.

Scholarship Application Process:

1. Complete the application (please read entire application before beginning to fill it out)
2. Current Resume
3. Provide three letters of recommendation (sealed in an envelope with signature of writer over the seal) from:
 - a. An instructor and
 - b. A manager from an employer (paid or volunteer) and
 - c. A volunteer coordinator, clergy or school official.
4. Provide official school transcripts.
5. Answer your essay question with no more than 1500 words, using Arial font, font size 12 point and double spaced.
6. Send all application materials together, post marked no later than March 1st, to:

The trustees of the scholarship foundation will award two scholarships each year (provided qualified applicants apply) in the amount of \$500 each, \$250 per semester. Scholarships are renewable for up to four years, but must be reapplied for each year.

Eligibility Requirements:

First: To be eligible for these scholarships applicants must have either a) had Mr. Mullin as a teacher, coach or principal or be a descendant (child, grandchild, great-grandchild, etc.), of such a person while Mr. Mullin worked for the Westfield School District in Oxford, WI. or b) had Mr. Mullin as an employer or a descendant child of a past employee of Mr. Mullin while he operated Mullin's Drive – In, Fox Lake, WI.

Second: Applicant shall be a high school senior or current student in good standing at a Trade School, Technical College, Community College, or four-year College or University.

Third: Applicants shall have a minimum of a 3.0 GPA and this GPA must be maintained. Transcripts are required with scholarship application and before the second disbursement of the scholarship.

Application Process:

First: Complete application and current resume.

Second: Provide three letters of recommendation from: 1) an instructor, 2) a manager (paid or volunteer), and 3) a volunteer coordinator, clergy or school official.

Third: Provide official school transcripts with application.

Fourth: Answer your essay question with no more than 1500 words, using Arial font, font size 12 point and double spaced.

Fifth: Send all application materials together. Completed application must be post marked no later than March 1st.

- c. Discuss how working for Mr. Mullin, at Mullin's Drive – In, has impacted your life and how that experience will impact your future both professionally and personally.
- d. Discuss how your parent having worked for Mr. Mullin has impacted your life and how that experience will impact your future both professionally and personally.

20. Please limit all personal identifying information in your short answers (other than question 1) and essay. All personal identifying information will be removed prior to application and essay scoring.

21. Mail completed application, current resume, three letters of recommendation, current transcript and essay to:

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
