USD #112 Board of Education met in regular session Monday evening, January 13, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. in the Central Plains Elementary School Cafeteria, in Holyrood, KS, with the following attending:

The board conducted the election of officers for 2020.

Chad Rogers nominated Tamara Dody for President. Joshua Hurley seconded the nomination.

Jacob Charvat nominated Brad Schiermeyer for President. Tami Schepmann seconded the nomination.

There were no other nominations.

Those in favor of Tamara Dody as President were Chad Rogers, Tamara Dody and Joshua Hurley. Those against were Tony Zink, Jacob Charvat, Brad Schiermeyer, and Tami Schepmann. The nomination failed by a vote of 3-4.

Those in favor of Brad Schiermeyer as President were Tony Zink, Brad Schiermeyer, Jacob Charvat and Tami Schepmann. Those against were Tamara Dody, Chad Rogers and Joshua Hurley.

The nomination of Brad Schiermeyer as board president was approved by a vote of 4-3.

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Election of Board President

Chad Rogers nominated Tamara Dody for Vice-President. Joshua Hurley seconded the nomination.

Tony Zink nominated Tami Schepmann as Vice-President. Tami Schepmann declined the nomination.

Tony Zink then nominated Jacob Charvat as Vice-President. Jacob Charvat declined the nomination.

Election of Board Vice-President

There were no other nominations.

Those in favor of Tamara Dody as vice-president of the board were Chad Rogers, Brad Schiermeyer, Tami Schepmann, Tamara Dody and Joshua Hurley. Jacob Charvat and Tony Zink abstained from voting.

At this time, 4th grade teacher Taylor Siemsen, along with two students, gave a presentation on their Robotics class. She reviewed how the robots are used and gave a demonstration on various commands, by the students and what they are learning in the class.

Gary Sechrist, from KASB, gave a report on the Futures Committee. He discussed the purpose and vision of the committee, district goals, challenges, and the building tours by the committee. He also shared the results of a survey that was distributed to district patrons.

- Discussed current board goals and possibly updating them with the new board members.
- Reviewed the CPJSHS security system and possibly implementing a student key-card system to exit the building to art class and shop class. He discussed a couple of different companies that could possibly implement this new security system.
- Reminded the new board members of their inservice training on Jan. 25, 2020 at Hays, KS. Existing board members are welcome to attend.

Open agenda items included the following: further board training on meetings and school finance; head of maintenance position; response letter from Senator Jerry Moran on SPED funding; Central Plains High School KU scholar students; Z-Space Computers and teacher training.

Future agenda items will include the following: Futures Committee, additional information on the Bushton Building; and KASB Configuration Study.
