

The Art Scholarship is a Full In-District Tuition Waiver (max. 19 credit hours per semester). It is based on merit and work ethic in the visual arts. The scholarship does not cover student fees, textbooks, supplies, meals, or housing.

Art scholarship recipients are expected to:

- Demonstrate ongoing commitment to high academic standards
- Actively participate in all SIC sponsored art activities
- Demonstrate leadership abilities and a spirit of cooperation while working with other members of the Humanities division including faculty and peers
- Participate in recruiting activities during the academic year with perspective students
- Commit and maintain a high level of personal artistic engagement by working additional studio hours and maintaining an active role in studio activities and critiques
- Contribute a minimum of 5 studio hours per week, outside of class time, toward the necessary tasks associated with maintaining an active and growing art program. These tasks include but are not limited to the following: Maintenance of studio and equipment, gallery and museum installations and removal of exhibitions, maintenance of the gallery and equipment.
- Assist in the publicity of the SIC Art program and associated events
- Be continuously enrolled for 12 or more semester hours (excluding summer) and maintain good academic standing, 2.5 GPA or above.
- First year students receiving the Art Scholarship are required to take ART 121 Art Appreciation (hybrid), ART 141 Drawing, and ART 161 Basic Art Design during the Fall semester and ART 143 Painting during the Spring semester.

The scholarship application must be turned in to the financial aid office by February 28, 2020. Make sure to:

-Email Sara DeNeal to set up an interview.

-Bring the following to the interview or send via email:

Personal Statement of Intent (approximately 500 words, typed double-spaced) Describe your personal, artistic, academic, and career goals. Explain why SIC was selected as the place to achieve your goals.

-Letter of recommendation.

-10 to 15 piece portfolio of artwork.
