STUDENT ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE PROCEDURES

Bus Riders

Bus transportation is available to students who live more than one mile from school (3/4 mile for kindergarten), and who have a valid bus pass. Students must have their bus pass every day, and there is a \$5 fee to replace lost passes. Bus riding is a privilege, not a right, and misconduct could affect the safety of all children on the bus. Students are expected to follow bus safety rules, including:

- Remain seated and facing forward at all times.
- Use a quiet voice.
- Follow the instructions of the bus driver.

Any abuse of these rules can result in suspension of bus riding privileges. Proper behavior at the bus stop is also expected. If a problem arises either on the bus or at the bus stop, please contact First Student at (760)244-4022. They will assist you with your concerns. Students who wish to ride a bus other than their assigned bus MUST provide a note from their parent or guardian stating the new bus route and the date of the change.

Morning arrival: Students will unload from the buses through the Cottonwood Avenue gate in the bus lane. Students will be met by a proctor.

Afternoon departure: Students will load the buses at the end of the school day through the Cottonwood Avenue gate. Students will be escorted to their bus by a teacher.

The bus lane is for BUSES ONLY. Please do not drive through or park in the bus lane at any time. Violators may be assessed a \$500 fine by School Police. All vehicles must stop when the red bus lights are flashing.

Car Dropoff - Pickup

Students are to be dropped off and picked up in the student pickup area only. Follow the traffic flow (double lane) through the drop-off/pickup lane, stopping alongside the curb. Children will enter or exit your car at this location. At no time should parents park or drive through the staff parking lot, as this can create a safety hazard at drop-off and pick-up times. Please follow the directions of school staff members supervising this area.

Morning drop off: Students will exit your vehicle at the curb and enter campus through Gate A (on the west side of the office building).

Afternoon pickup: Drive through the single traffic lane and wait your turn until your car reaches the curb. Teachers will escort students to the pickup area and the duty teachers will assist the students into the car. Students will NOT be released to walk across the parking lot or across the street.

D Gate- Walk up Pick up

Parents may park off campus and walk up to pick up their student(s) down in our Kindergarten area. Parents will enter through Gate D and pick up their student(s) and exit through Gate E. Students will not be released without an adult present.

Walkers

Morning arrival: Students are to use the crosswalks and sidewalks to enter the school at Gate A. Students are NOT to walk through the parking lots.

Afternoon departure: Students will meet the duty teacher at designated tables in the cafeteria. The students will then be escorted to the end of the sidewalk next to the entrance to the pickup lane if they walk towards Maple Ave and will be escorted to the crosswalk if they walk down Cottonwood Ave.

PLEASE NOTE: This is NOT a parent pick up area. Students are expected to walk home.

<u>Bicycles</u>

Students who wish to ride their bikes to and from school must fill out the required forms in the office. Helmets are required equipment for all bike riders. Bikes must be parked and locked in the bike rack during the day. Students must provide their own lock and chain. The school is not responsible for stolen or vandalized bikes. At no time are students allowed to ride their bikes on Cottonwood's campus or in the parking lot.

ANY CHANGES TO THE WAY STUDENTS GO HOME, EVEN TEMPORARILY, MUST BE MADE IN WRITING AND TURNED IN TO THE OFFICE IN ADVANCE. CHANGES WILL NOT BE MADE OVER THE PHONE FOR SAFETY REASONS.

* IMPORTANT REMINDERS*

Red zones are unauthorized parking areas.

Please park legally at all times. Do not park in red zones, bus zones, or block parking spaces, crosswalks, trash dumpsters, or residential driveways or mailboxes.

Remember, Muscatel Avenue is a school zone. Please observe the 25 mph speed limit, and reduce your speed to 5 mph in the pickup lane.

PARENT VISITORS POLICY

If you would like to volunteer or observe in your child's classroom, we ask that you make arrangements with the teacher at least 24 hours in advance, and we will add you to our visitors list for the day. Please check in with the office when you arrive. All visitors must provide an ID when checking in. For security reasons, parents are not permitted on campus before school or during the school day without a scheduled appointment or for a scheduled school event.

"HEALTHY SNACK" GUIDELINES

Since our school has a focus on nutrition and physical fitness, and due to recent laws limiting the sale and distribution of unhealthy foods, we strongly encourage you to consider nutritional options when bringing in treats for class celebrations. Good examples of this would be yogurt, graham crackers, fruit juice, fruit and vegetables, and other "non-sugary" items. Please check with your child's teacher or the front office before buying items to bring to school.

LOST AND FOUND

Our lost and found is located in the school cafeteria. If your child loses a jacket, backpack, sweatshirt, etc., he/she should always check there first. It is always helpful when parents put their child's name inside the item so it can easily be identified and/or returned. Please be aware that we donate all lost items to charity on the last day of each month, so don't delay once you notice something missing!

RACHEL'S CHALLENGE

Rachel's Challenge is a schoolwide program created by Darrell Scott, the father of Rachel Scott -- a student involved in the Columbine HS incident in 1999. The goal of the Rachel's Challenge program is to encourage students to be kind to each other, offer encouragement to their classmates, and create a "chain reaction of kindness" whenever possible. Cottonwood has implemented this program as part of our commitment to bullying prevention, and to create a positive school culture of acceptance and kindness.

By accepting Rachel's Challenge, Cottonwood students strive to:

- Look for the best in others
- Dream big
- Choose positive influences
- Speak with kindness
- Start a chain reaction of positivity

PARENT INVOLVEMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Parent Teacher Club (PTC)

School Site Council

Cottonwood's School Site Council (SSC) is a group composed of staff members and parents. Its function is to identify areas of need within the school and develop ways to meet these needs. The SSC is responsible for monitoring and evaluating the instructional focus of the Single Plan for Student Achievement, and making budgetary decisions to implement school programs. English Learners Advisory Council (ELAC)

The site ELAC is an advisory committee to the School Site Council. The ELAC is composed of parents, community members, and Cottonwood staff members. This committee is responsible for making recommendations related to EL students' needs, the development of the Single Plan for Student Achievement, and assessment of instructional programs.
