

Attention New Seniors and Parents Senior Picture Guidelines

2019-2020

It's time to be thinking about senior portraits for your child. Please read through the items below regarding portrait requirements and deadlines. *I am requesting that portraits for the composite be received by **February 15**.* Also, when placing the order, he/she needs to tell the studio which headshot pose they want used for the composite and ask them to send it digitally to me at rfliehler@wc.k12.ia.us or place it on a cd or flash drive for you to bring in to me.

Portraits for the formal composite must meet the following requirements:

1. **PLEASE** have a head and shoulders shot taken for the composite. This should be a full-face pose—not the side of the face. Also, **no hands/arms** in the photo.
2. Nothing can be on top of the head—this means hats, etc.
3. Jpeg image size of wallet to 4 x 5 at 300 dpi

NOTE: If your senior is not able to get a headshot taken, they can get one taken in September when regular school portraits are taken or I will take one for them.

Students may use a different photo for their senior spotlights and yearbook.

Baby Photos- Seniors need to bring in a baby photo for the senior spotlight/yearbook. The baby photo can be black & white or color, any size; it can even be from a photo with a sibling, etc. If you can't find a good baby photo, early school photos work well also. The photo will be scanned and then given back to the student right away.
