Title IA: A Parent's Guide

What is Title IA?

The federal government gives money to states and school districts to help students meet state standards in reading, writing, and math.

Title IA Schools must:

- Identify needs and set goals for improving reading, writing, and math for students.
- Develop programs to support and supplement learning for each student.
- Measure student progress.
- Work together with families.

Title IA in Easton Elementary School

The Title IA program is working to help students meet their goals in reading, writing, and math; create a positive school culture; and form strong partnerships between schools and parents.

Schools might do this by:

- Adding extra time and specialized teaching to help students gain the skills they need.
- Offering summer school.
- Providing personalized learning.
- Offering staff learning opportunities to improve teaching.
- Helping families understand how to support their child's learning.

How Parents Can Help

You can help your child and all children by becoming active at your child's school.

- **Communicate:** stay informed and respond to information sent home, and keep in touch with your child's teacher.
- **Set an Example:** show your child how important learning is. Attend Parent/Teacher conferences, know how your child is doing.
- **Get Involved:** volunteer at your child's school, join the PTO, or serve on a committee.
- **Learn:** find out how to help your child with school work and homework.
