


### Highlights include...

**Pre K** - Building a Foundation for Living, Learning, and Working Together

**Kindergarten -** Many Roles in Living Learning and Working Together

1st grade - Leadership, Cooperation, Unity and Diversity

**2nd grade -** Global Geography: Places and Peoples, Cultures and Resources

#### Pre K-5 Standards by grade

**3rd grade -** Massachusetts, Home to Many Different People

**4th grade -** North American Geography, History, and Peoples

**5th grade** - United States History to the Civil War and the Modern Civil Rights Movement

## **Pre K-5:** focus on 4 fields of social studies - civics, geography, history and \*economics

\*Examples: **1st grade** " how people make choices about purchasing goods and services and saving resources" **2nd grade** "how people earn a living, exchange goods and services, and save for the future"
