

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How many students are in each class?

Students are able to work individually and in groups to learn the skills necessary to be successful in the real world. Classes are sized for students to get a variety of training experiences.

Does this replace my classes in high school?

Students attend Mercer County Career Center for half a day. While at the Career Center, students are in their program learning the competencies needed to complete their career program. Students take their required academic courses at their high school. Career Center students earn credits toward their graduation requirements. Students can still participate in their home school's clubs, organizations, and activities.

What kind of hand-on experience will I receive?

Students who attend Mercer County Career Center learn the skills and techniques through classroom instruction, but spend more time applying those skills and techniques in real-world, hands-on applications and experiences. What happens if I start in one program, but decide that I prefer a different program?

Planning for a career should begin in elementary school. Guidance Counselors work with students to ensure their interests match their career goals in the middle school levels.

By the time students make a decision to come to Mercer County Career Center, most of this planning has taken place. To be eligible for many certificates, students have to be in a program for two years; however, program changes can be made on a case-by-case basis.

Will I be more marketable when looking for employment?

Students who graduate from the Mercer County Career Center have developed a career portfolio, earned a variety of business/industry credentials and have gained the experience of working in real-world, high-tech scenarios making them ready for entry-level employment.
