

Dave Ciafre is a 1966 graduate of Shaler High School and a 1975 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh with a degree in Counselor Education. Dave began his 40-year wrestling coaching career in 1979 at Riverview Junior High School before assuming the junior varsity coaching duties from 1981-1985 and, then, became the varsity head coach from 1986-1990. He served as head coach at Mercersburg Academy for one year (1991-92) before moving to Sharon High School in 1993. He has coached 41 section champions, 82 district placewinners, 40 regional placewinners, 18 PIAA state placewinners and three PIAA state champions. Dave worked the Clarion Wrestling Camps as a coach from 1983-2016 and the Clarion Team Camps as a coach from 1999-2006 before serving as head administrator of the Clarion Team Camps from 2006-2016. Dave's been actively involved with PA USA Wrestling as Junior Nationals Coach (1985-97), Junior National Assistant Coach (1985 90) and Head Coach of the PA Freestyle Junior National team from 1990-1997. During his time with the PA Freestyle National Team, he coached some of the most recognized names in PA wrestling history. He also served as a Pennsylvania Freestyle/Greco Roman official from 1983-1997 and was named the PA USA Wrestling Official of the
