
The 1989 class "B" Boys Basketball State Champions!





The '88 season was one of adversity and character. The Cats opened the season with a win over the always tough lpswich Tigers. The Cats went on to post six more consecutive wins, one being over the DeSmet Bulldogs who would later win the state championship. At 7-0 the Cats would play their final game of the regular season at Conde for the conference championship. The Wildcats played well against a quick Doland-Conde team, considering the loss of key players, which left the continuity of the defense and offense at question. The Cats lost the hard-fought and exciting game 15-14 and finished the regular seson at 7-1 and conference runner-ups. The Cats, for the second time in the last three years, ended the regular season no. 2 in their Region and qualified for the playoffs to face a tough, solid Sully Buttes team. With the combination of weather and more injuries, the Cats ended their season with a successful 7-2 record. Looking back at the adversity which the Cats endured both physically and mentally due to injuries, their 7-2 record is a great example of the type of character and pride Northwestern football has become noted for.






# Let's Hear It For Spirit


