



### **Student Placement Process at the Elementary**

Beginning soon, the staff and Administration will begin the process of grouping students for placement into classrooms for the 2014-2015 school year. This is a major undertaking, which we address thoroughly and thoughtfully.

The ultimate goal for the classroom placement process is to create well-balanced heterogeneously grouped classrooms of students. The placement team considers all students' strengths and needs with regard to academic proficiency across all content area, social competency, emotional maturity, leadership qualities, family support, learning style needs, behavioral dynamics, peer relationships and any services received. Your child's present teacher and other support staff members have a wealth of information about the conditions under which your child learns best. They will share this information with us as part of the placement process.

Balancing classroom groupings assures that all students get the teacher attention and energy they deserve and that our school system's educational philosophies and best practices models for teaching and learning are actualized to maximize learning outcomes for all students. As you can appreciate, it is an artful challenge, not a perfect science. We do not look solely to match children with specific teachers since that would not help us achieve our goal and would make the process susceptible to staffing variables, which are vulnerable to change.

Parent requests for specific teachers will not be granted. If there is compelling information that the school should consider when placing your child, please submit it to me in writing (not the classroom teachers as it is unfair to put them in a conflicting predicament) by June 6th, 2014 otherwise please trust us to make decisions that have every child's best interests in mind. We realize that on occasion there may be extenuating circumstances when a teacher preference needs to be considered. For example, if a prior relationship with a prospective teacher would make things awkward (she/he is a neighbor or relative), you are certainly welcome to share that information with us. We want everyone positioned to have the best year possible while being appreciative and respectful of the wide range of diversity in a public school experience. Know that any letters we receive will be shared at the placement team meetings.

As we plan for next school year, there will be some changes in teacher assignments. Additions or reductions in grade level configurations are being made at some grades to adjust for shifting enrollment trends.

We will be providing a program called Looping for 1st graders in Mrs. Langhans' classroom. Looping is an educational practice in which a single graded class of students stays with a teacher for two years. The student and the teacher remain together as the class is promoted. For students, the benefits of Looping include reduced apprehension at starting a new school year, increased continuity and more in depth relationships with teacher and with peers. For teachers, the benefits of Looping consist of becoming familiar with broader developmental stages of children and working with students and parents for longer periods of time. The long-term relationships established through Looping have been shown to support student learning. If for any reason you think your child wouldn't do well with the same teacher for two consecutive years, please alert us to opt them out of the Looping classroom configuration if your child is in Mrs. Langhans' classroom.

Thank you for working with us to support the learning of all our Fall River Elementary Students.



# **Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports**

Fall River School District adopted PBIS in 2012 to help create and maintain a positive school climate and an effective learning environment within the school. Again, this year, the staff at Fall River has been working hard to continue to implement PBIS district-wide and the students have been extremely responsive to the initiative. We have had monthly Pirate Rallies at the elementary level to promote positive expected behaviors. At the middle school and high school level we have been using pirate prizes to recognize those students that demonstrate positive expected behaviors. In April, the PBIS team brought Carl "Energizer" Olson in to present to all of the K-12 students. While here, he focused his presentation on the positive behaviors we expect to

**Attention parents of students entering 5K in the fall:** Before your child enters kindergarten, please be aware that the Wisconsin Immunization Law requires Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine or the date your child previously had the disease.

Also, please be aware that one dose of DTaP vaccine is required after the 4th birthday. For children who are "up to date" with their preschool DTaP series this will be final (5th) dose that is recommended to ensure prolonged protection, primarily against pertussis also known as whooping cough. For children who are not "up to date" this dose may be the 3rd or 4th in the series and no further doses are required. Because of a 4-day grace period, DTaP vaccine received 4 days or less before the 4th birthday is also acceptable. Expect a letter home before the end of the school year with all the details.

**Attention parents of students entering grade 6 in the fall:** Before you child enters 6th grade, the Wisconsin Immunization Law requires a TdaP. Tdap is the adolescent combination vaccine that protects against tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (whooping cough). Only one dose is required. Parents are required to have their child vaccinated or claim a waiver. Expect a letter home before the end of the school year with all the details.

Attention parents of students with medication at school: Medication consent forms are only valid for one school year. Please remember to come to school during the last few days of school to pick up the remainder of their medication. You will have until **June 13, 2014** to pick up the medication or it will be disposed of. We will be unable to send any medication home with a child.
