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## **PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS**

**AUTOMOTIVE-** Come join us to explore the Automotive Technology program! Come work on a vast array of vehicle repairs that help keep our cars on the road today.

**BIOMEDICAL SCIENCES -** Every cell in your body contains DNA, the substance that makes you, you! Have you ever wondered what it looks like? In this camp, you will painlessly extract DNA from your own cells and preserve it so you can later be cloned! Just kidding, but you can take it home to admire forever. You will also extract DNA from fruit for comparison.

**CULINARY ARTS –** Have a fun day seeing what the “Art” in Culinary Arts is all about! From table set-up and napkin folding to a beautiful garnish demonstration of strawberry fans, scallion flowers, radish roses & apple bird carving. Students will observe the preparation and proofing of soft-roll dough and work it into knot rolls, cloverleaf rolls, and braided breads. Of course, a morning in the kitchen isn't complete without preparing and baking chocolate chip cookies and scones! Kitchen safety and proper food handling will also be covered and observed.

**DIESEL TECHNOLOGY –** Come and learn about local opportunities in our trade and experience what it's like to work as technician alongside one of our great students.

**HEALTH OCCUPATIONS (Medical) –** Health Occupations Scrub Camp: This camp we will practicing treatment of bone fractures, putting on casts, and learning about physical therapy careers and equipment.

**LAW ENFORCEMENT –** Local game warden Eric Rudolph will be presenting a brief talk about the Maine Warden Service. Students will then have the opportunity to participate in a compass course and shelter building outside.

**MULTIMEDIA DESIGN –** Students will learn the basics of videography and editing by creating a short film. This will include learning how to operate Adobe Premiere Pro video editing software to create special effects like chroma key, where students stand in front of a green screen and the color is replaced with a different background. Students will also learn the crop effect, which is used to create twins or triplets of classmates.
