In addition, Annie Dowling, the Field Day coordinator, will be talking about Field Day: getting us geared up for the festive end of the year event.


## Mark Your Calendars!

## Helpful Tips for Awesome Attendance

Remind your child that school is their first and most important job! Tardies and early release times can count as "parts of days."

Communicate the importance of regular school attendance to your child so they are hearing the same thing we are saying at school.

If your child has a doctor/dentist appointment, they can still get credit for a full day if they attend at least some of the day. You can bring them before or after their appointment with the note from the doctor.

If your child is running a fever, vomiting, or has diarrhea, they need to be kept home. If they are symptom free for 24 hours, please send them to school!

#### Do the Math:

K-12 = 13 years of school

Missing just 1.5 days per month X 9 months in a year = 13.5 days

13.5 days X 13 years = 175.5 days

Almost 1 whole year of school

Send a note or call the office every time your child is absent. 444-3073



## 18 or More Days Per Year

Excused and unexcused absences represent lost time in the classroom and lost opportunities to learn.



## 10-17 Days Per Year

Students who are absent an average of 15 days a year miss a year's worth of school before their senior year.



### 9 or Fewer Absences Per Year

Students with good attendance generally achieve higher grades and enjoy school more.
