Parents experiencing a temporary crisis can arrange for their children (0- 18 years) to stay with Safe Families (SF) volunteers while addressing issues leading to instability in their lives. SF volunteers are supervised by their area church, supported by professional specialist, with case managers providing full support. Children matched with families in their own community, and placements average one day to three months. Homes open to children whose parents are experiencing short-term emergency, such as hospitalization, or a longer-term crisis, such as drug abuse. Designed to extend and strengthen the community safety net for at-risk families, Safe Families is a positive alternative to the state child welfare system, allowing parents to work out their problems without having to worry about losing custody of their children.
