
CAT SCRATCH FEVER


HEDGEHOG CLUES

My hedgehog is about 6 months old. At first, she was very active and loved attention. She always had a really hearty appetite by eating every morsel of food and enjoyed vigorously running on her wheel. Lately though she's been wobbling about with her eyes half open. She is also eating much less then usual. Plus, her water bowl is almost always

untouched. She still runs on her wheel, but it does so rather weakly. She sleeps a lot too, of course. However, she doesn't curl up into a tight ball. Today, I found her laying around almost <u>unresponsive</u> when I poked her. After I picked her up, she went into a half-ball. I knew something wasn't right. Immediately, I put her on a heating pad. She started moving sluggishly around with the heat, but still seems very lethargic. HELP!

LITBERNATION LIELP!

Hedgehogs need to stay warm, as hibernation can be fatal. Additional heating supplies may be <u>required</u>. For example, a thick layer of bedding, fleece pieces, or a snuggle sack are good items for a hedgehog to cuddle up in. The surrounding room temperature should be no lower than 72 degrees. Heating pads under a corner of the cage are fine. That way they can get up against it or away from it as needed. If your hedgehog does try to go into hibernation, the fastest and safest way to warm it up is to put the hedgehog on your chest between two layers of shirts. It will warm up from your body temperature. Usually within 10 minutes, the hedgehog will begin to <u>recover</u>. However, if the problem continues, visit a veterinarian right away.


