Pursuant to NJAC 6:20-2.13(e), we certify that as of January 31, 2020, after review of the secretary's monthly financial report (appropriations section), and upon consultation with the appropriate district officials, that to the best of our knowledge no major account or fund has been over expended in violation of NJAC 6A:23-A-16.10(c) 3 & 4, and that sufficient funds are available to meet the district's financial obligations for the remainder of the fiscal year.

 - 12.02a. That the Palmyra Board of Education includes in the proposed budget \$350,000 to be transferred from the district Maintenance Reserve account. The district has fully exhausted all eligible statutory spending authority and must increase the base budget in the amount of \$162,361 for necessary operational costs that must be completed by the end of the end of the fiscal year and will not be deferred or incrementally completed over a longer period of time.
