BEAVERHEAD COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL Resolution of Intent to Impose an Increase in Levies March 9, 2020

Beaverhead County High School is committed to financial transparency. Senate Bill 307 (SB307) requires the District to provide notice of its intent to increase non-voted levies in the ensuing fiscal year. As an essential part of its budgeting process, the Beaverhead County High School Board of Trustees is authorized by law to impose levies to support its budget. The Beaverhead County High School Board of Trustees estimates the following increases in revenues and mills for the funds noted below for the next school fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, using certified taxable valuations from the current school fiscal year as provided to the district:

The District intends to use the permissive levies listed above for purchase of buses, maintaining prior year adopted budgets, addressing some of the needs of the facility including repairs and upgrades to the recirculation pump system at the main building, and dealing with District safety issues.

These estimates are the District's best estimates at the current time. They are based on the current year's taxable value, as required by SB307. If the District's taxable value increases, the mill and taxpayer cost will be less than presented here. These estimates are preliminary and changes are expected before the final budgets are set in August.
