In consideration of the fact the World Health Organization has declared the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) a Worldwide Pandemic, SSC will implement the following:

1. In the event of a confirmed coronavirus case involving an SSC student, staff member, or close relative of either, or a confirmed case in the SSC community we will close schools in consultation with the HCHD or ISDH or the IDOE.
2. All students, teachers, and staff who are assigned devices for school/home use will take these devices and the chargers home each night. They are to be charged each night. There are to be no exceptions. In the event of a school closure announcement late in the evening or early morning everyone assigned a device will be ready to proceed with eLearning Lessons.
3. Teachers are to prepare five (5) new lessons and at least one (1) review lesson for now and until the end of next week (March 20, 2020). If they are not needed, they may be used during in house classroom instruction.
4. Over the what now appears to be the two (2) week spring vacation administrators will continue to monitor the updates from the health organizations and the IDOE regarding the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

We will share updates on school information and schedules based upon information on COVID-19 via school messaging, the SSC Website and SSC Facebook.

5. Everyone is to understand that if you contract or show symptoms of the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) you most likely will be subject to a two (2) week [fourteen (14) day] quarantine period. This quarantine is assigned to individuals by healthcare professionals.

If you travel outside the United States or even possibly inside the United States, you will most likely be subject to COVID-19 screening, testing, and possible quarantine at home.

Please Remember: The school does not screen, test, or assign quarantines. We do monitor school staff and students for illness and virus-like symptoms. We will be required to report individuals with these type symptoms to the Henry County Health Department.

Everyone please be cautious, continue to practice good health hygiene, and take care of yourselves and your loved ones.
