Definition of Title I

•Title I provides federal funding to schools to help students who are low achieving or at most risk of falling behind.

•Title I is allocated to schools based on the percentage of student receiving free/reduced lunch.

•Central Intermediate is a Schoolwide Title I School. All students are eligible for Title I services.



Math Websites

Numberock.com (Grades K-5th) - Add free music videos of songs about math topics (money, integers, fractions, etc.)

ArithmeticFour (Grades 2nd-8th) - Players try to connect four game pieces in a row like the Connect Four game. Players earn game pieces by correctly answering math questions.

Coolmathgames.com (Grades K-12th) - Hundreds of math games on various concept are offered on this site. Students can also play games on their other site Coolmath4kids.

Math Game Time (PreK-7th grade) - Students can play math games and get homework help.

Math Playground (Grades 1st-6th) - More than 475 math games, logic puzzles, and brain workouts for students to practice their math skills.

XtraMath (Grades 1st - 8th) - Allows students to practice and master basic math facts (addition, subtraction, multiplication, division). This is a great website to improve math fluency.

ABCYA (Grades K-8th) - This website has a lot of games related to math concepts. It allows children to play games to improve math skills and math fluency.
