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Good Evening Families,

This week presented many challenges to our Granby community. I want to first, take a moment to say thank you for your patience. Our decision to close school was made with the utmost concern for the safety and health of our students, our staff, our families, and our community. I cannot understate the gratitude I have for each of you as we move through this extended closure. The disruption to our routines, the challenges we face balancing work, childcare, and family obligations and the unknowns we are facing in this challenging time are unprecedented. As I stated in my letter this morning, our children need to know they are safe, that those that they care about are safe, and that we are working to keep them safe.

Monday, March 16th and Tuesday, March 17th, schools will be closed and no work will be assigned to students. On these days, staff will be working to develop extended "blizzard bag" assignments for students. Our goal with these assignments will be to extend learning experiences and keep students in the learning mindset. Like "blizzard bag days", students will have access to assignments in the same platform teachers have provided assignments in the past. For our youngest students, we are working on the details of how to distribute assignments and resources to families. We will address this in future correspondences. Teachers will communicate with students and families when they will be available each day to answer questions and provide clarifications. Teachers will also provide feedback on assignments. Unlike "blizzard bag days", students will not have attendance requirements associated with completing assignments. These assignments will begin on Wednesday, March 18th and continue tentatively through Friday, March 27th.
