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Dear Families, March 16, 2020

Governor Baker announced the closure of all Massachusetts' public and private schools through April 6th. For more information regarding Governor Baker's response to COVID 19 and other emergency orders, please visit https://www.mass.gov/info-details/covid-19-state-of-emergency. This is an extension of our closure by one week. However, as has been the case, the situation is extremely fluid and changing on a daily, if not hourly basis. We are writing this letter to provide some additional information regarding the closure, things you can do to keep your families healthy and safe, and how we are working to provide learning experiences to keep our students in the learning mindset over the coming weeks.

What can we do to prepare for COVID 19?

In last night's address, Governor Baker declared emergency orders establishing social distancing procedures. This includes keeping six feet from others, limiting exposure to groups over 25, and continuing to practice the habits of washing hands regularly, covering coughs and sneezes, and staying home if you are sick. Digital Support and Internet Access

We are currently establishing procedures and updating our network infrastructure to allow for school devices to be used outside of our schools. There are federal mandates which require our network and devices meet standards for internet safety should devices be taken home. While we were working to implement these changes for the upcoming school year, we have shifted our timeline to purchase required network upgrades immediately and support students who do not have either internet or

devices to complete work in the online/digital content environment. We hope to have this implemented by the end of the week. If you need internet access or devices so that your child can complete assignments in the online environment, please reach out to your building principal. We will provide more information specific to distribution of devices within the week. We will also provide information to access the internet that has recently been made available.

Food Instability Support

We recognize that many families rely on our food services to provide healthy, nutritious meals for our students. In addition, many families are relying on our Granby to Go program for supplemental food supplies. Currently, the Governor and DESE commissioner are working to provide flexibility for school districts with less than 50% of students receiving free and reduced breakfast and lunches the opportunity for reimbursement of meals we provide during this period of closure. Until we receive more information on this reimbursement, Granby to Go will be providing additional food drops for families in our program. At this point, we will be delivering food once a week. Our paraprofessionals are working in the program to help pack and deliver food. Working with teachers in the online environment

Our goal over the next three weeks is to keep all students in the learning mindset and continue, as much as possible, in providing learning experiences and assessments to ensure learning in the curriculum. It is very important that you help establish the routines that students are accustomed to in our classrooms, as students are learning at home. This stability of routine provides a sense of normalcy for our students. If you have any questions or concerns about accessing learning resources and activities, please reach out to your child's teacher and principal so your concerns can be addressed. Many teachers have established new phone numbers (google or zoom) to communicate with you during this time. Also, you may receive a call from a restricted number as staff may be using *67 if communicating from private home/cell numbers. Please do not hesitate to use these phone numbers and our regular email accounts to continue communicating about your child's learning.

Providing health updates to nursing staff

Just as if your child was sick at school, it is important to provide our nursing staff with updates on any changes to your child's health. Open communication will be essential in determining community spread of COVID 19, levels of influenza, and general health related concerns as we make decisions in the coming weeks.
