Use a separate piece of paper to complete each of the 5 days. Make sure your name is on each paper.

### Figurative Language

**Simile** - comparing two things using “like” or “as”

**Metaphor** - comparing two things without using “like” or “as”

**Onomatopoeia** - sound/action words

**Idiom** - a phrase with a nonliteral meaning

**Personification** - giving human traits/abilities to nonhuman things

**Hyperbole** - extreme exaggeration

**Alliteration** - repetition in the same beginning letter or sound

### Elements of Plot

**Exposition:** when characters, time, and place are introduced.

**Rising action:** when tension is building and leading up to climax

**Climax:** the most exciting part of the story

**Falling action:** when conflict is resolved

**Resolution:** end of story
