

Dear Wynnewood Public Schools' Parents, Guardians, and Friends,

Through this time of uncertainty and extended school closure, our biggest concern is the health and well-being of our students. We know that nutrition plays an important role in the healthy growth and development of our young people. With help from our State and Federal Governments, we are happy to say that Wynnewood Public Schools will be providing a sack lunch as well as a sack breakfast for not only our Wynnewood students but for ALL of our Wynnewood children ages 1 – 18. Both meals will be provided every day throughout the two-week closure FREE of charge to all children.

For our students who ride the bus, our bus drivers will be following their regular bus routes and stopping at each house to deliver the meals. They will start their routes at approximately 12 noon each day. The safety and well-being of our drivers is important to us, too, so they will not be leaving the bus and knocking on doors, but upon arrival at your homes, they will sound their horns and wait a few minutes for you or your children to come to the bus and pick up your meals. Meals will be delivered at approximately the same time each weekday beginning Monday, March 23rd through Friday, April 3rd. Please call the Superintendent's office if you do not wish to have meals delivered to your home.

If we mistakenly miss a house, please call the Superintendent's office at 405-665-2004, and we will deliver the meals to you right away.

We will also have meals available in the high school cafeteria for pickup between 11:00am – 1:00pm each day. If your child or children do not ride a bus and cannot pick up their meals at the high school cafeteria, call the superintendent's office at 405-665-2004 any time after 8:00am beginning on Monday morning, and we will deliver your meals. It should be noted that when the two meals are delivered or picked up for each child, the lunch is meant for that day, and the breakfast is meant for the following morning.

If any of our community's elderly citizens, disabled citizens, citizens with a health related issue that prevents them from getting out, or any other citizen that needs food or assistance, please have them reach out to us or have someone reach out to us on their behalf so that we can try to meet their nutritional needs.

The bottom line here, folks, is that we are a community that takes care of each other, and that doesn't become any more evident than when we are going through a tough time. Thank you for your kindness and caring hearts, but most of all, thank you for ALWAYS supporting our kids. Stay safe and stay well.
