Facilities Study Report: Tim Ruppert, Brad Simonson, and Jake Berens from HSR Associates discussed findings from the engineering audit and facilities study. A second community input meeting will be held soon.

Athletic Updates: Todd Camlek confirmed that the 8-man football team will still be a cooperative team with Kickapoo. Camlek is in the process of renewing the cooperative agreement with Youth Initiative, and has begun the groundwork to potentially develop a coop with Viroqua for hockey in the next few years.

Looking ahead for baseball, projected numbers for upcoming students interested in playing baseball may not be enough to field a La Farge team. The District may need to look for alternative opportunities. There is a deadline of June 1, 2020 to apply for participating in a coop baseball team with Kickapoo for Spring 2021.
