

# Facility Entry Screening Protocol

## Patient and Visitor

### Questions:

- Have you had a fever of 100.4 or greater? Even if they say no, we must take their temperature to confirm. ONLY temporal temperatures, no other methods of obtaining temperatures should be used.
- Do you have a cough or shortness of breath?
- Do you have other symptoms that seem like flu or pneumonia?
- Have you traveled out of the state or out of the country or to Colorado, Washington State, Florida, Texas, New York in the last 14 days?
  - **If yes, they are not allowed to enter and need to be sent home and asked to call to reschedule their appointment.**
- In the last 14 days, have you had contact with anyone who has had lab-confirmed COVID-19?
- If the answer is yes to any of these questions, they need to be sent home and directed to call their PCP
- If it is a co-worker, they need to be sent home and directed to notify their leader and employee health

## Co-worker

### Questions:

- Have you traveled to Colorado, Washington State, Texas, Florida or New York in the past 14 days?
- Have you had a fever >100.4, cough, or shortness of breath in the last 2 weeks?
- **If the answer to either of these questions is yes, the co-worker needs to be sent home and instructed to call their leader.**

The screeners should always wear gloves and a regular Droplet mask.

Screeners should NOT touch people entering the building. If they do, they need to remove gloves, complete hand hygiene and put on new gloves.

The screener must be the one signing everyone into the log, not the people being screened.

The screener must clean the thermometer between each person.

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
