- At least 20 minutes choice reading (books or e- readers) daily
- Record your daily reading on a Reading Log.
- 20 minutes of written journaling, responding to these prompts each day
- 30 minutes Istation Reading
- 30 minutes IXL Math
- Pearson Math Assignments
- STEMScopes Science Assignment
- Master 2 skills per week in IXL

11:15 - 11:45 am	Journaling & Social Emotional Learning  • Spend 30 minutes completing the activity or prompt that is found here.				
11:45 - 12:45pm	Lunch and break Suggestion: Listen to an educational podcast! Try <u>Wow in the World!</u> If you like science, <u>Stories Podcast</u> or <u>Circle Round</u> to hear a story, or <u>Noodle Loaf</u> to learn about music!				
12:45 - 1:30pm	Complete your science assignment in STEMScopes and Pearson Math. Log in to Google classroom to receive your assignment!

- Khan Academy Kids (ideally doing it while sitting next to a parent or older sibling giving them positive feedback for effort). Khan Academy kids start at the basics of letters, numbers, and social emotional learning, through the first grade standards in math, reading, writing and social emotional learning.
  - For students with stronger literacy and motor skills:
  - o Khan Academy <u>Kindergarten</u>, <u>1st grade</u> and <u>2nd grade</u> math can be appropriate. Ideally a parent or older sibling sits next to them while doing this. One practice that <u>we've seen teachers use to great effect</u> is to have **all** students start on <u>Kindergarten</u> and then move to <u>1st grade</u>, <u>2nd grade</u>, etc. This helps ensure that older students are progressing with accumulating gaps. It also helps build momentum and confidence.
  - O Course challenges and unit tests can be used to accelerate through material. For students with minimal gaps, they should be able to get through a previous year's content in 1-3 hours.
