A message from the Superintendent

Dear Staff and Families,

I wish to welcome you to the 2022-2023 school year. As I have visited classrooms in each of our schools over the first few days, I have enjoyed watching the connections being built between students and their teachers, the



positive interactions occurring between students, and the engaging classroom lessons and activities. The first day was filled with excitement as students arrived at school and as our administrators, teachers, and staff welcomed them. There were some new routines, continued traditions, and "getting to know you" activities in many of our classrooms. A focus area for our district this year is on **community building** - in each classroom, in each school, and throughout the district - so each student feels *valued*, *included*, and *engaged*. I hope to further develop student leadership opportunities throughout the district, including creating Superintendent's Advisory Committees of students.

I have enjoyed meeting so many of our families throughout the summer and during the start of school. Curriculum Corner

Into Literature

English teachers in grades 6-12 will be implementing

Into Literature this year. Into Literature is on Rhode Island's approved list of high-quality instructional materials and uses authentic literature and texts to engage students in reading, writing, speaking, and listening. The online platform also contains *Writable*, a



tool that provides students with frequent writing practice and feedback. According to the state's curriculum legislation, all students should have access to high-quality materials in English/language arts and mathematics by September 2023.

Suicide Prevention

All personnel hired or contracted by the school district including lunch personnel, substitutes, transportation personnel, and coaches will complete suicide prevention training this fall in accordance with the "Nathan Bruno and Jason Flatt Act".

In addition to annual personnel training, all students in grades 6-12 will also receive annual training which will be incorporated into the health curriculum. Smithfield is using the state-approved Signs of Suicide (SOS) program which stresses the ACT message: Acknowledge, Care, Tell.

School Renovations


