

SGTC Dual Enrollment (DE) Registration for Summer and Fall Semester:

Registration for students intending to take Summer and/or Fall classes with SGTC will be done a little different due to school closure.

Students will register thru email from **April 6th-April 8th**. Only students who have the required SAT/ACT/Accuplacer/HOPE GPA will be eligible for participation during summer and/or fall semester.

Students will email Cindy Hagerson, High School Counselor at chagerson@schleyk12.org the classes they are intending to take indicating the semester, either Summer and/or Fall.

Mrs. Hagerson will ensure the classes are eligible for DE funding and align with graduation requirements. Mrs. Hagerson will then email SGTC to register the students for classes.

Upon the return of students to school we will then fill out the student's online application for funding. This is not something the student has to complete at this time for registration.

Students who have **never** taken classes with SGTC **or have taken a semester off** will have to complete an application for DE.

SGTC DE Applications are located outside the front of the high school building.

Applications can be picked up and returned during the week of **March 30th-April 8th**.

Upon completion of the DE application, they should be placed in the box located outside the front of the high school building.

Below are the updates from GA Student Finance Commission for Dual Enrollment beginning the semester of Summer of 2020.

Eligibility

As of summer 2020 semester, 9th grade students will no longer be eligible to participate in Dual Enrollment. 10th grade students will be eligible to take CTAE classes at a technical college with qualifying Accuplacer, ACT, or SAT scores. 10th grade students will also be eligible to take core classes IF they have scored the following: 1200 SAT, or 26 ACT scores. 11th and 12th grade students will be eligible to take both core and CTAE classes with qualifying scores on Accuplacer, ACT, SAT, PSAT, or HOPE GPA of 2.6 or higher. The only exception is returning 10th grade dual enrollment students who took core classes in 9th grade- they will be eligible to continue taking core classes, since they already began taking them in 9th grade.

30 Hour Cap

As of summer 2020 semester, all new dual enrollment students will be eligible to receive 30 credit hours of dual enrollment funding. Any classes taken beyond 30 credit hours will not be covered by the Dual Enrollment program. For returning students who have taken 18 credit hours or less as of summer 2020, they will be held to the 30 credit hour cap. For returning students who have taken 19 credit hours or more as of summer 2020, they will be allotted an additional 12 credit hours of funding. Once these credit hours are funded, any additional hours will not be funded by Dual Enrollment.

Additional Changes

As of summer 2020, students will no longer be allowed to retake a course if they previously failed the course or withdrew from the course. Dual Enrollment funding will NOT cover retaking any courses. Additionally, if students withdraw from two classes, they will no longer be eligible to participate in the Dual Enrollment program for the remainder of their high school duration.

Core Classes

Eligible students will be able to take the following core classes either online or at the SGTC campus: MATH 1111, ENGL 1101, ENGL 1102, PSYC 1101, SOCI 1101, HIST 2112, POLS 1101, ECON 1101, PHSC 1111

*Note: Dual Enrollment no longer covers Fine Arts classes, such as MUSC 1101 or ARTS 1101. Students will not be able to take either of these classes under the dual enrollment program.

CTAE Classes

Eligible students will be able to take CTAE courses. Although most of these are offered at the SGTC campus, some programs (such as Criminal Justice, Early Childhood, and Computer Science) do have classes online that students may take. If students take these classes at the SGTC campus, they are typically offered two days a week. There are morning classes (typically from 8:00 am-10:00am, or a similar timeframe) and evening classes (typically from 5:00pm-8:00pm, or a similar timeframe). Some examples of CTAE programs include: Criminal Justice, Early Childhood Education, Computer Science, Welding, Diesel Mechanics, Automotive Mechanics, Air Conditioning Technology, Medical Assisting, Avionics, and Barbering.
