Did You Know?

* OHS's graduation rate went from 96.7% in 2021 to 100% in 2022

* 100% of Oxford's classroom teachers are licensed for the grade level and courses they teach.

*This fall, 75% of all 7-12 grade students have been involved in one or more extra curricular activities.

*60% of the senior class is taking one or more college courses this fall.

* In 2022- 57% of 3rd graders scored in the highest two levels on the state reading assessment; this up from 42 % in 2021.

*In 2022- 73% of 3rd graders scored in the highest two levels on the state math assessment; this up from 42% in 2021.

*In 2022- 58% of all 4th graders scored in the highest two levels of the state reading assessment.; this up from 41% in 2021.

*20% fewer Oxford students scored in the lowest level of the state math assessment from 2021 to 2022.

*USD 358 earned Kansas State Department of Education Star recognitions for individual plans of study and social emotional learning.
