## **Meal Account Balance Policy**

This year the requirements to return to paid meals and pre-covid regulations are in place. The transition from free meals during Covid may be confusing. Our goal is to provide breakfast and lunch for children who want to eat at school, so if your family needs assistance, or needs clarification, please contact the school. Below is a summary of the policy.

Students eating meals at school should maintain funds in their meal account. If a student has a negative meal balance, ala carte or extra items may not be "charged" to the student's meal account.

When a students has charged the maximum amount (\$20) to his or her account (regular breakfast and/or lunch), and cannot pay cash for a meal, an alternate meal consisting of a peanut butter, or cheese sandwich and milk will be provided.

Parents should be receiving low balance notification through PowerSchool once a balance goes negative. (Please contact your child's school if you are not receiving meal balance notifications.) In addition, at least one written warning will be provided to a student and his/her parent or guardian when a balance is close to or exceeds the district's charge limit of \$20. Mrs. Metz and Mrs. Guthrie try send notices weekly and talk to students individually.

Payments for school meals may be made at the school, district office, or online. Students, parents, and guardians of students are encouraged to prepay for meals. The application to qualify for free meals or reduced priced meals can be found on the district website <u>www.usd358.com</u> or a paper copy can be completed at the school.

The goal is to insure any student who wants to eat can eat!

### What are Tier Support, Seminar, and ET Time?

Tier Support is based on a MTSS, or multi- tiered support system for students. All students in grades for grades 7-12 have the course on their schedule for 2nd hour. Students are grouped based on I-Ready and STAR reading and math assessment results or target task groups. Groups meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays to work on their targeted area. On Monday and Wednesdays, students have time to study, complete work for courses, meet with teachers, or work on their individual plans of study. At the Elementary School, this process is called ET or Enrichment Time. The elementary has two dedicated times; one for everyone to work on reading and a second for work on math. The goals is to push students to improve math and reading skills. Seminar is a 25 minute time for grades 7-12 to work on Individual Plans of Study, portfolios, college and career meetings, organization meetings, time to work on assignments and study.

### School Closure Procedures

It's winter weather season, which means there may be times school will close due to hazardous conditions. Notifications will be made as soon as possible through Swiftreach -automated calls, texts and emails. Notices will also be posted on the district website, and social media sites (Facebook and Twitter). KSN, KWCH, and KAKE will post the information as well. Please make sure your contact information is correct in PowerSchool. If a phone number or email address has changed or not correct, contact the school office.
