1st Grade Learns About Baby Chicks

1st grade students had an exciting month learning about the life cycle of baby chicks! Over the past 21 days, students have waited patiently and watched eggs incubate in the classroom. Students explored how

an embryo develops inside of a chicken egg over time, took notes, discussed the life cycles, and observed similarities and differences between parents and offspring. They also learned how to candle test the eggs and make predictions. Finally, this past week they have observed 7 of the 12 eggs



hatch into baby chicks (with one more on the way!).
