Introduction

USD 358 is located in south central Kansas serving Pre-K to 12th grade. USD 358 has three schools. Oxford Elementary (PK-6), Oxford Jr./Sr. High School (grades 7-12), and Oxford Online Virtual School (grades K-12). The district is also the host district for the Orion Adult Education Winfield program. The district employees 36 certified teachers, 7 at risk instructional aides, two k-12 counselors, one elementary principal, a k-12 assistant principal/virtual principal and one 7-12 principal/superintendent. The 619 Interlocal provides special education services to identified students in the district.

The current Board of Education goals are:

- 1. Student Academics- USD 358 will use data to develop systems of support to increase rigor and raise expectations for student performance on school improvement measures.
- 2. Instruction- USD 358 will utilize district Professional Learning Community groups to guide school improvement and professional development activities to impact student performance
- 3. Social Emotional- USD 358 will increase self-regulation and resiliency skills for academic gains and post-secondary success.

The district completed its first five-year KESA accreditation cycle in 20-21- earning full State Board Accreditation. Oxford participated in a regional school improvement pilot program to start year 1 of the new cycle with KSDE in 21-22 and is now moving to year three. The current district improvement goals are:

- 1. USD 358 will increase the percentage of students performing proficient on the state math and reading measures to 60% by 2026 (earning a level 3 or 4 score on the assessment)
- 2. USD 358 will decrease the percentage of students chronically absent to 5% by 2026.

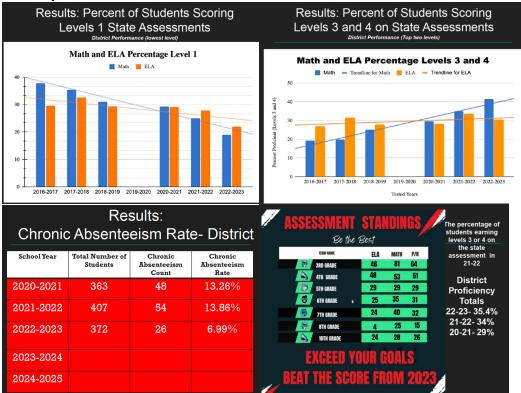
