Journal Writing Reading Bingo Cursive Practice Grammar Taboo Vocabulary Squares	Have students start a journal to record their daily activities and events happening in the news each day. Make a bingo board with different ways to read and have students do each task until they get a bingo. Examples for bingo tasks would include the following: read in a blanket fort, read in the sunshine, read to mom and dad, read in the dark with a flashlight, read while laying down, read to a stuffed animal, read in a silly voice, etc. Have students use spelling words or words from a book they are reading to practice cursive handwriting. Students can use dry erase markers, crayons, markers, colored pencils, or chalk. Make cards with grammar words written on them including adverb, verb, noun, possessive noun, proper noun, adjective, subject, verb, predicate, conjunction, contraction, period, exclamation mark, question mark, quotation mark, etc. Decide who goes first and take turns drawing cards and placing them on forehead (similar to the game Head's Up). Describe the word on the card without saying the word. Take turns going back and forth and see who can get the most correct in one minute. While reading, have students write down words they do not know. Draw four boxes on a sheet of blank paper to look like a window. Write the word in the middle. In one box, have students write the definition of the word (you can use a dictionary or google). In the second box, have students use the word in a sentence. In the third box, have the student write a synonym or antonym of the word.
