MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING GOVERNING BOARD GUSTINE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FEBRUARY 10, 2016

TIME AND PLACE

The regular meeting of the Gustine Unified School District Board of Education was held on Wednesday, February 10, 2016. The meeting location was changed to the Gustine High School Auditorium, 501 North Avenue, Gustine, California.

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Board President Pat Rocha. The Board went into Closed Session and reconvened to Open Session at 7:20 p.m.

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT

Mrs. Pat Rocha, Board President, Mrs. Crickett Brinkman, Mrs. Loretta Rose, Mrs. Linetta Borrelli, Mr. Ernie Longoria.

REPORT FROM CLOSED SESSION

Board President Pat Rocha said the Board has met with the Superintendent and provided him feedback regarding a six month evaluation. The Board is pleased with Mr. Morones' performance and looks forward to working with him in the future.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Mrs. Rocha indicated that Agenda Item VI-A would be removed (LCAP Report). Mrs. Rose made a motion to approve the Agenda as amended, seconded by Mrs. Borrelli. Motion carried, 5-0.

REPORTS AND PRESENTATIONS

- A. Student Report Meg Abdallah presented her report of activities at Gustine High School.
- B. Board Reports Mr. Longoria said that he attended the Board Policy Study Session/Special Meeting, the LCFF meeting as well as the Special Board Meeting on the Mascot issue. Mrs. Rose attended the active shooter program at Romero and she hopes to see the program expanded to all of our schools and said the Sheriff's Department did a very good job. She attended the girls' basketball game, LCAP meeting and the Board Policy Study Session. Mrs. Rocha said she was able to attend a girls' basketball game as well as the FFA Dinner/Dance. She thanked administrators for their reports and the Board would accept them as presented in the interest of saving time during this particular meeting. Mrs. Rocha attended the active shooter drill/hostage situation drill at Romero. She commended Mrs. Filippini, her staff, and the Merced County Sheriff's Department for a great job.
- C. Staff Reports As presented in Board packet.
- D. Financial Report Presented in the Board packet. The report reflected an ending cash balance for January 2016 of \$3,403,104.
- E. Attendance Summary Lizett Aguilar provided in the Board packet the GUSD Attendance Summary and Comparison which reflected a total average attendance district-wide of 95.57%.

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F. Superintendent Report – Mr. Morones said he attended the active shooter drill and hostage situation drill at Romero Elementary and commended Principal Lisa Filippini and the Merced County Sheriff's Department for a great job putting it all together. He feels it is a program that needs to be happening throughout the District to ensure the safety of students, staff and the community. Mr. Morones said he attended a teacher recruitment job fair with all of our administrators and personnel department which will give the District a head start in recruiting teachers for the upcoming school year. He also attended the FFA Dinner/Dance and was very impressed with the event. He facilitated the third Bond Oversight Committee Meeting during which District Architect Mitch McAllister presented information on the Facilities Master Plan, information presented to the Board the week before. Mr. Morones also commented on the GHS WASC visit and said the WASC team was very impressed with all of the work that Dr. Petrone and his leadership team has done at the high school. "They felt they were in Utopia for the last two and-a-half days." Overall, he said the feedback from the WASC Committee was extremely positive.

CONSENT AGENDA

Mrs. Brinkman made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda as presented, seconded by Mr. Longoria. Motion carried, 5-0.

INFORMATION

A. Educator Effectiveness Funding – Kim Medeiros provided information on the Educator Effectiveness Grant which is part of the 2015 Block Grant. She said this funding will support mentoring, including the BTSA induction program for teachers and administrators. Part B will be for professional development coaching and support services for teachers identified as needing support for improvement. Funding for teachers and administrators in Common Core standards, conferences, workshop release time covering and building on the professional learning community that we have already started in our District. Next would be to promote educator quality and effectiveness in the classroom and support that with professional learning communities and conferences to help build those skills.

COMMUNICATION FROM THE PUBLIC

Mr. Morones explained that a 1% increase to salaries was negotiated with the Collective Bargaining groups to be effective in 2015-2016 if certain LCFF revenue criteria was met. The criteria was relating to Average Daily Attendance growth, Unduplicated Pupil Percentage (UPP) increases, and LCFF GAP funding increases. This criteria has been met and, as such, approval is requested for a 1% increase to all salary schedules effective July 1, 2015.

- 3. Disclosure of Collective Bargaining Agreement Conf/Mgmt/Admin/Supt. -- Mrs. Brinkman made a motion to approve the DCBA for Confidential/Management/Admin/Supt, seconded by Mrs. Borrelli. Motion carried, 5-0.
- 4. Salary Schedule Increase of 1% effective July 1, 2015 for all Salary Schedules -- Mrs. Brinkman made a motion to approve the DCBA for a salary schedule increase of 1% effective July1, 2015 for all salary schedules, seconded by Mr. Longoria. Motion carried, 5-0.

- D. Maintenance Department Equipment Purchase Mr. Longoria made a motion to approve the purchase of a loader bucket attachment for the Maintenance Department, seconded by Mrs. Brinkman. Motion carried, 5-0.
- E. GMS Music Department Purchase Mrs. Borrelli made a motion to approve the purchase of student chairs and storage carts for the GMS music department, seconded by Mrs. Brinkman. Motion carried, 5-0.
- F. GHS Mascot Selection Board President Pat Rocha indicated there were eleven people who submitted speaker cards and each person would be allowed to speak for three minutes.
- -- GHS student J.D. Laupua said the name he would prefer from the three that were chosen, a lot of students voted for "The Tribe."
- -- GHS student Sebastian Figueroa said he was told there were three favorites and he thinks we should choose a name, not necessarily one that we could stick with the same mascot.
- --Craig Christenson said the name should be changed as little as possible and we should wait until the last moment to change and not rush into it. He feels the name should be "Reds."
- -- Community member Robert Borba said he agreed with Mr. Christenson that we should not rush into the name change and are we breaking the law if we go with "Reds"? He feels we go back to the name "Reds" to go along with the GHS fight song, "Sons of the Gustine Reds."
- -- GHS Parent Sherri Marsigli said we have until January 2017 and the name doesn't have to be chosen tonight if the Board and community feel the need to wait. She also said that we can keep the Chief and be called the "Reds."
- -- GHS Student Niko Marsigli said it's a shame to see the name Redskins go and history will be rewritten. He just wants to make sure that the Board makes a decision that will not be regretted by everyone.
- -- Attorney Bruce Sousa said that when he, his father and brothers played football for GHS, they broke the huddle with "Go Reds." Their uniforms had G's on them and did not have an Indian logo. The Committee wanted to recommend the name "Reds" but didn't because they felt there were some legal issues. He said the color red conveys not Redskins but all of those values and the image of strength that people have come to associate with wearing red ties and red shirts.

- -- Rick Nagel, Committee member, said that he served on the Mascot Naming Committee and said he had been somewhat intimidated by recommendations that the committee avoid "Reds." He said it is the Board's decision but his choice was "Reds" despite what he recommended as a member of the committee.
- -- Mayor Dennis Brazil commented that he thought the process was out of order to have the comments prior to the power point presentation. He said the Board knows his opinion of AB 30, but aside from that, he feels that Gustine High School started as "Reds" and it seems only common sense to go back to "Reds." He said that the name on the game wall says "Gustine Reds" already and he doesn't see any controversy with the mascot name being "Reds." Mayor Brazil also suggested that the process be slowed down to give the community and everyone involved a chance to digest all that has happened and he hoped the Board would postpone the decision to another meeting.

Mrs. Rocha thanked those who spoke and also the Mascot Naming Committee and everyone who put a lot of time and effort into the process of selecting a new mascot for GHS.

Superintendent Morones stated that at the January meeting he was directed by the School Board to convene another community meeting and the purpose was to elicit input from community members who do not have access to technology to give their input on a new mascot. "Most of the people who attended (and in this room) had access to technology but it was a very strong opinion that I was hearing from the group and that was the mascot should be 'Reds.' That was loud and clear that people are very passionate about the mascot "Reds." I had a follow-up conversation with Board members individually after the community meeting and I asked Counsel to come again this evening. Since that meeting, we have had further dialogue which went back to 75 years ago when we were "Reds." Counsel has since talked to staff members and others and has formed a modified opinion. My directive from the Board was to convene a mascot name change committee which Dr. Petrone did, and they came back with Aggies, Chiefs and Torros. At this time I am asking that you strongly consider 'Reds.'"

Legal Counsel Scott Holbrook commended Superintendent Morones and GHS Principal Dr. John Petrone for their work putting the committee together with the Board's direction. He said the legislature enacted the law but provided no guidance about having to implement the law. Mr. Holbrook provided an overview of the intent of AB 30 and the District's responsibility to comply with the new law. He then said that since the January meeting he has had an opportunity to talk with staff and he now has a better understanding of the history of the use of the term "Reds" and that at one point in the District's history it had nothing to do with the Native American mascot and was simply just the term affiliated with one of the school colors, red and white. In that context, if the District were to decide to move forward with the recommendation to use "Reds," if that term was used without a Native American mascot, some other mascot, he said the District is in a stronger position to demonstrate that it is complying with AB 30.

Mr. Holbrook said, "The current concern that we have as a law firm is if you use the term "Reds" and continue to use the Native American mascot, because it is a form of the term Redskins and it is associated with the term "Reds", when it's next to a Native American mascot it might be perceived to the court sitting in review as noncompliant with the law prohibiting use of Redskins. If you move forward with "Reds" with the Native American mascot, it only takes one person out there, and there are unscrupulous lawyers that will take a case and file a lawsuit, and is it something that the District wants to expose itself to? Our recommendation is no. But if the District were to move forward with "Reds" and choose a new mascot, it would be in compliance with the law."

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Mrs. Rocha said the Board has given the public the opportunity to speak and Board members would now consider the issue before them. Mr. Longoria said that the name "Reds" should be considered as the GHS mascot name with the logo image to be decided later. Mrs. Brinkman said she did some research and found that in past years, GHS sports teams wore jerseys with the symbol "G" on them. Her opinion is that we should go with "Reds." Mrs. Borrelli said she would like to see the name as "Reds" to reflect the history that we have and then all that needs to be done is change the logo. Mrs. Rose said as much as she hates to lose the Redskins name, she feels that since "Reds" was one of the top choices, it should be the name selected for the new mascot, along with the letter "G." Mrs. Rocha said she has been in Gustine all her life. She and her four children and grandchildren are all Redskins and always will be. We will spend more time on changing the logo because that doesn't need to be changed right away, but for now Mrs. Rocha indicated that she is in favor of changing the mascot name to "Reds."

Mr. Holbrook said that because the law does require that a mascot be identified by 2017, if it is the Board's desire to move forward with adopting "Reds" as it's mascot, it should be suggested in that motion that you include language that the Board will reconvene at a later date to adopt a new non-native American mascot.

Mrs. Brinkman made a motion to approve the new GHS mascot name as "Reds" with a non-native American mascot to be selected at a later date. Mrs. Borrelli seconded. Motion carried, and the name "Reds" will be the new GHS mascot beginning with the 2016/17 school year.

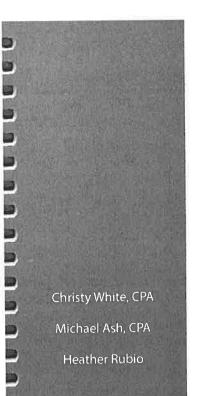

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the Measure P Bond Building Fund of Gustine Unified School District (the "District") as of and for the year ended June 30, 2015, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Measure P Bond Building Fund's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinions.

As discussed in Note 1A, the financial statements present only the individual Measure P Bond Building Fund, consisting of the net construction proceeds of the Measure P general obligation bonds as issued by the District, through the County of Merced, and are not intended to present fairly the financial position of the District in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the Measure P Bond Building Fund of Gustine Unified School District as of June 30, 2015, and the respective changes in financial position for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Other Reporting Required by Government Auditing Standards

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we have also issued our report dated February 22, 2016 on our consideration of the Measure P Bond Building Fund's internal control over financial reporting and on our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements and other matters. The purpose of that report is to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the Measure P Bond Building Fund's internal control over financial reporting and compliance.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

In accordance with the requirements of Proposition 39, as incorporated in California Constitution Article 13A, we have also issued our performance audit report dated February 22, 2016 on our consideration of the Measure P Bond Building Fund's compliance with the requirements of Proposition 39. That report is an integral part of our audit of the Proposition 39 Bond Building Fund for the year ended June 30, 2015 and should be considered in assessing the results of our financial audit.

SUMMARY:

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

E-Rate is a program that provides discounts to assist schools and libraries in the United States to obtain affordable telecommunications, Internet access, internal connections, and basic maintenance of internal connections. This program is administered by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) under the direction of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).

The Merced County Office of Education (MCOE) is assisting the Gustine Unified School District (GUSD) with filing for E-Rate Year 2016 funding and bidding documentation. The E-Rate Year 2016 will commence July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017. The GUSD E-Rate Year 2016 discount is 80%. The remaining 20% will be paid by the district.

ISSUE/DISCUSSION

GUSD has applied for E-Rate Year 2016 to off-set the costs of wide area network (WAN) connections for the Gustine schools and the District Office, Internet access for the students, and financial system services for the District staff. Our WAN is what connects all of the sites to one central location and then in turn, this central location connects to the Merced County Office of Education (MCOE).

The district did not receive any bids during the initial bidding process. After the initial bidding process, MCOE solicited quotations from various telecommunications providers and received quotations from 2 telecommunication providers – Zayo Networks and AT & T.

Below are the highlights of each proposal –

- 1. Zayo Networks
 - a. The company is located out of state and has little to no experience in California.
 - b. The company is proposing dark fiber. Dark fiber is now e-Rate eligible and it allows GUSD more flexibility in increasing the network bandwidth (capacity) as needed. As such, this solution is a cost effective solution for bandwidth growth.
 - c. Selecting this vendor would require a one-time expenditure for installing the new fiber at the Gustine schools and the District office.

- d. The on-going costs for the Gustine schools and district office are less than the AT & T proposal.
- e. The agreement would be for a period of 5 years.

2. AT & T

- a. The company is offering lit fiber services at 1 Gigabit speed.
- b. The ongoing cost is higher than Zayo Networks
- c. GUSD will have to incur additional cost to increase the bandwidth.
- d. The agreement is on a month-to-month basis.

Since this matter is time sensitive, contracts for both entities are currently being reviewed.

Therefore, we request the board's approval to -

- i. Enter into contract with either Zayo Networks or AT & T for the WAN connections to the Gustine schools and the District Office.
- ii. Enter into contract with AT & T for the WAN connection to connect to MCOE to provide Internet access to the Gustine students and financial system services to the District staff.

FISCAL IMPACT

If Zayo Networks is selected, the estimated cost of the WAN connections for the Gustine schools and the district office will be \$99,600.00 for one-time cost and \$720.00 for on-going monthly costs. We are currently in negotiations with Zayo to pay the one-time costs over 4 years.

Meanwhile, if AT & T is selected, the estimated cost of the WAN connections for the Gustine schools and the District Office will be \$1,517.00 per month.

In addition to either one of these, the estimated cost of the WAN connection to connect to MCOE to provide Internet access to the Gustine students and financial system services to the District staff will be \$379.25 per month.

All proposals are accepted contingent on the receipt of E-Rate funding.

RECOMMENDATION

The Superintendent recommends approval of the E-Rate proposals for WAN connections as follows:

- i. Enter into contract with either Zayo Networks or AT & T for the WAN connections to the Gustine schools and the District Office.
- ii. Enter into contract with AT & T for the WAN connection to connect to MCOE to provide Internet access to the Gustine students and financial software services to the District staff.

This report includes the District's financial and operational revenues, expenditures and all necessary disclosures as of January 31, 2016. The District Governing Board of Education must certify in writing whether or not the District is able to meet its financial obligations for the remainder of the fiscal year, and based on current forecasts, for the two subsequent fiscal years, 2016-17 and 2017-18. The certification shall be classified as positive, qualified, or negative, pursuant to standards and criteria adopted by the State Board of Education (Education Code 33127).

This Executive Summary consolidates the most important financial information for the Board of Trustees. The Executive Summary consists of: a Narrative, Budget, Ending Balances & Reserves, Budget Assumptions/Highlights, and Enrollment Projections. In addition, detailed budget information and additional supplemental reporting are also available for further reference.

The first part of the Executive Summary below is the General Fund Combined (Unrestricted & Restricted) Budget, with totals by Revenue and Expense categories for the 2015-16 2nd Interim projections and the two subsequent years, 2016-17 and 2017-18. There is steady growth and stability in LCFF revenues with a dip in 16-17 total revenues due to the elimination of 1x State revenues received in 2015-16. Expenses in 16-17 also drop for the corresponding elimination of the 1x expenses. This is followed by a slight increase to expenses in 17-18. Deficit spending is eliminated in all years. This projection continues to be a favorable financial outlook for the District's future years.

The next part of the Executive Summary below shows fund balances for 2015-16 2nd Interim projections and the two subsequent years.

This first green section represents the totals for the <u>Unrestricted funds</u> that are in the General Fund. <u>The vast majority of Unrestricted funds are comprised of LCFF funding</u>. The numbers show the increase to the fund balance after revenues, expenses, and transfers/contributions have been totaled. <u>The deficit spending in UnRestricted Funds has been eliminated for all projected years</u>. This indicates the deficit spending we had in 2014-15 was temporary and is now eliminated as LCFF revenue continues to grow and close the funding gap districts have been managing for the past several years.

Eliminating UnRestricted deficit spending in our projections is a very critical and positive step to improve the district's financial position.

The blue section below shows the same information as above, but for the Restricted funds. Restricted funds consist of programs such as Title I, II, and III, Special Ed, Ag/ROP, Maintenance, and other local grants. The deficit spending projected in the budget for all of the years below is typical of restricted funds. This is because Restricted fund balances are due to carry-over funds that usually need to be spent the following year. This is reflected in the gradual reduction to the ending fund balance.

This next section below shows the <u>Combined totals for Unrestricted and</u> <u>Restricted funds</u>, representing the total General Fund. As noted previously, deficit spending is eliminated in all the projected 3 years as the LCFF funding increases.

The other significant thing to note are reserve levels. For the 2015-16 2nd Interim our reserves decrease slightly to 8.81% (previously 9.74% at 1st Interim). As explained at 1st Interim, the 15-16 reserve is "artificially" lowered due to large carry-overs and 1x budgeted expenses. As these expenses are eliminated in 2016-17, the reserves show steady and stronger growth in the two subsequent years, at 15.52% in 16-17 and 23.97% in 17-18 (previously 16.46% and 24.83%). Also, keep in mind all 3 years decreased as compared to 1st Interim due to the addition of the 1% Salary increase to all staff.

It is strongly recommended and fiscally prudent to have a reserve that exceeds the 3% state required minimum reserve, which for our district averages \$575,000 over the 3 years. This 3% minimum reserve requirement is barely just over half of our average monthly payroll, currently at approximately \$1,000,000.

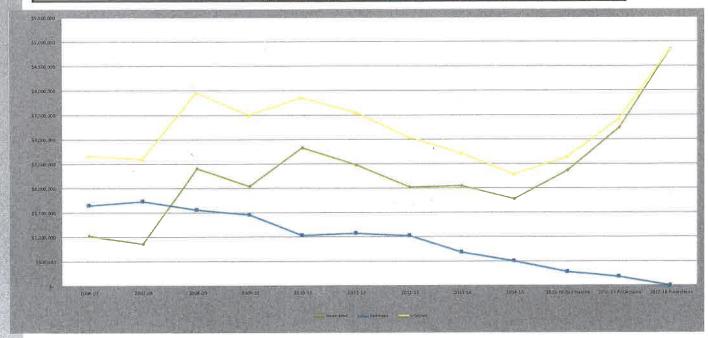

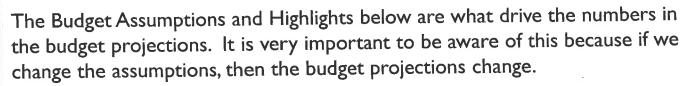

As reported at 1st Interim, the district had a projected balance in Fund 17 of \$149,782. In an effort to more accurately reflect the intended use of these funds, they have been transferred to Fund 40, Special Reserve for Capital Outlay. It is the intent to use these funds for potential facility needs. This can help comply with Williams requirements, as it is one of the state priorities of the LCAP.

The chart and graph below illustrate 12 years of fund balances and demonstrate our ability to remain fiscally solvent as we worked together during the most difficult financial times. Now that we continue seeing increases to LCFF funding, we should also continue to strengthen our financial position. This will better prepare us to weather any potential volatility in funding as we have experienced such volatility in the past.

BUDGET ASSUMPTIONS/CHANGES:

Some of the most significant changes to 2nd Interim are the increases to LCFF Funding of \$44,130 in 2015-16, \$258,772 in 2016-17, and \$297,082 in 2017-18. These increases are due to increased Unduplicated Pupil Percentage (UPP) and GAP funding rate.

The UPP for 2015-16 LCFF funding (a 3 year average) increased slightly from 78.62% to 78.88%. The UPP single year rate for 2015-16 increased slightly from 80.18% to 81.11%.

The GAP funding rate changed slightly in 2015-16 from 51.52% to 51.97%, but more significantly in 2016-17, from 35.55% to 49.08%, and 2017-18 from 35.11% to 45.34%. These GAP increases are major factors for LCFF increases.

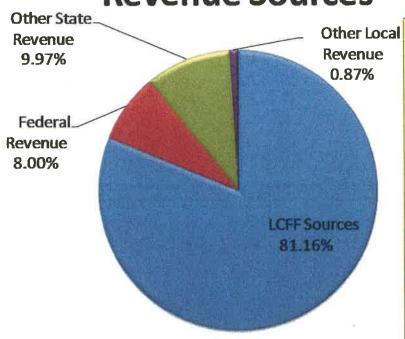
Another significant change in all years is the additional expense of \$107,084 to reflect the 1% Salary Schedule increase for all staff approved by the Board at the February meeting.

Also of continued importance is the inclusion of the significant and compounded year over year increases to STRS and PERS expenses of \$150,000 in 2015-16, \$170,000 in 2016-17 and \$230,000 in 2017-18.

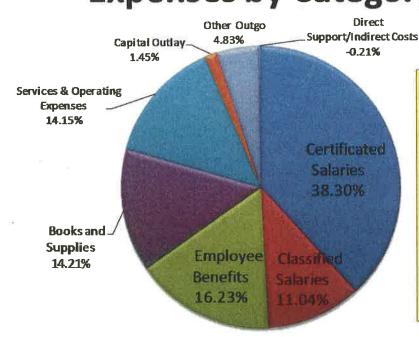
2015-2016 2nd Interim Revenue & Expenses

Our staff is one of our most important assets and in turn they are the largest portion of expenses in the budget. Union negotiations for the 2015-2016 and 2016-17 years are just getting underway and any potential cost increases have <u>not</u> been included. As a point of reference, a 1% salary increase is detailed and highlighted in green below for each employee group.

Also below are the costs of <u>Step & Column Increases</u> to all staff, an average of \$178,000/year over each of the next 3 years. These Step & Column increases <u>are</u> included in the budget projections for all 3 years.

The following graph shows 7 years of actual enrollment and projections. The actual enrollment numbers, for the first 5 years, reflect our enrollment at the time of CBEDS reporting to the state, which is measured in October. The successive 2 years are projections of our enrollment based on a graduating movement by grade and a conservative Kindergarten enrollment. Current actual enrollment for 2015-16, at 1,888. This is the 4th consecutive year of enrollment growth for the District with a total growth of 164 students. Enrollment drives attendance, which in turn drives funding and student performance. The District is currently focused on improving attendance rates, with an ambitious goal of 96%, and we will continue to monitor and report attendance rates for the 2015-2016 school year.
