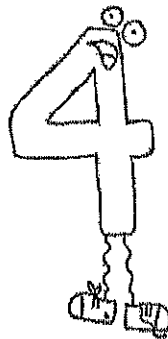

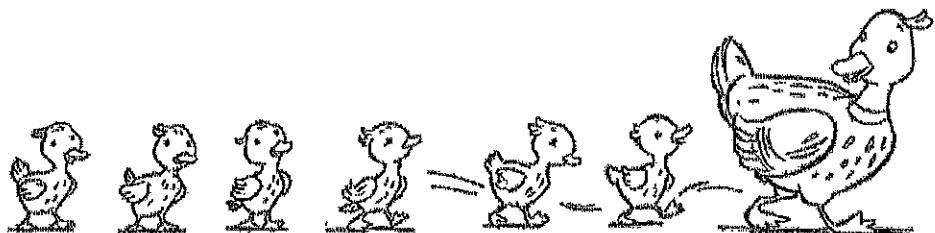

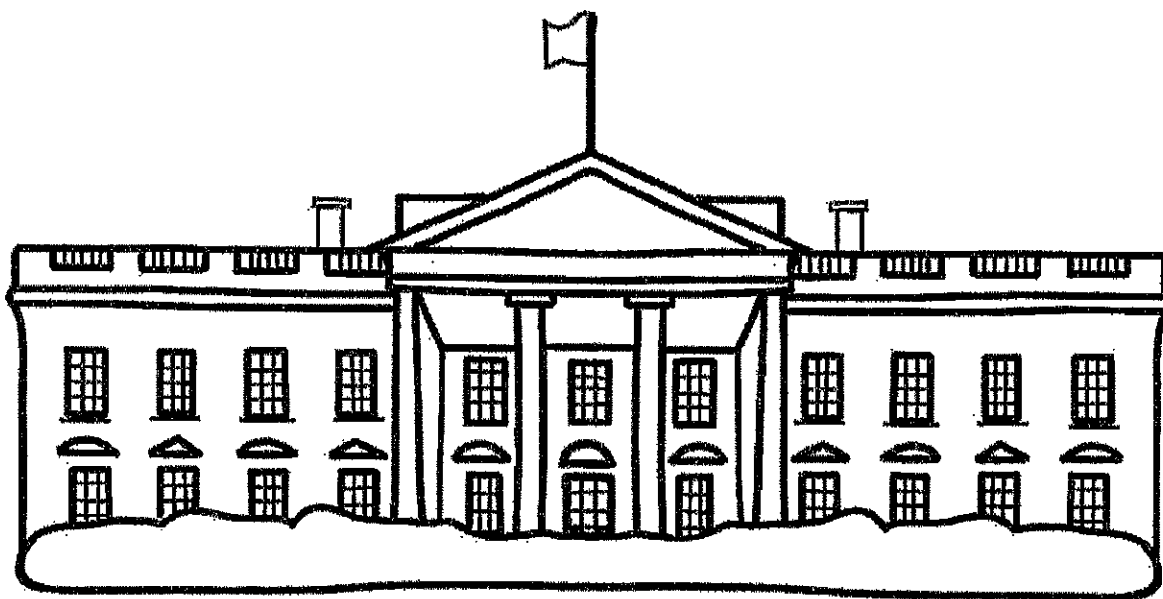
What's a Symbol?

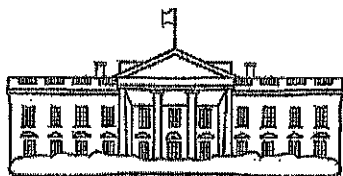
Did you know that there are many important symbols for the United States? Can you name any of these symbols?

These symbols represent our country and make us proud to be Americans.

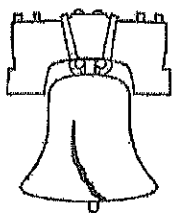

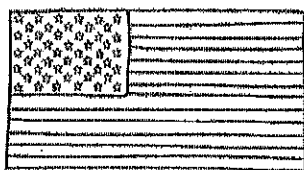
American Symbols

The Liberty Bell is a symbol of American freedom. It was rung on July 8, 1776 to announce the Declaration of Independence.



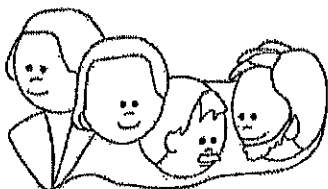
The American Flag is an important symbol of the US. It stands for freedom and can be found in many places around the country.

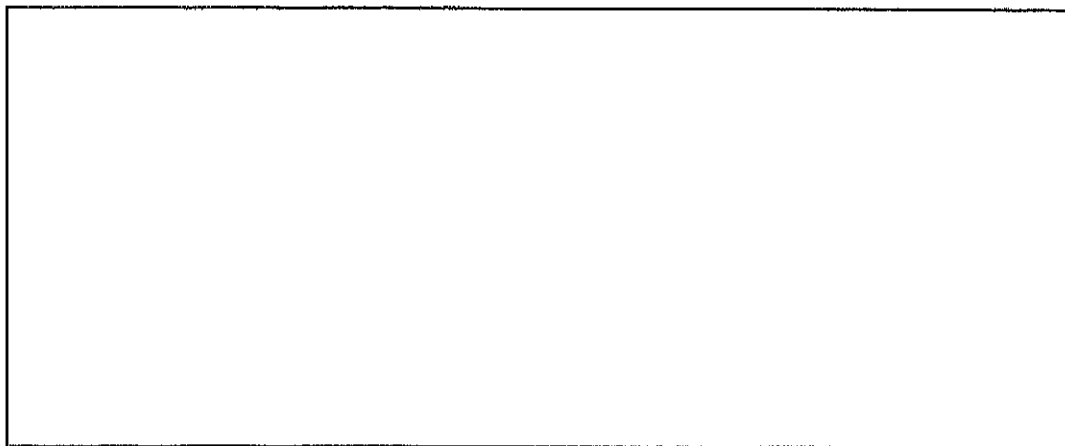

One of the most recognizable American symbols is our flag.

The flag is a symbol of **freedom**.

The flag is made of fabric. It has 50 stars to represent each of the 50 states. There are 13 stripes (7 are red and 6 are white) which represent the original 13 colonies.

Each color on the flag is a symbol.

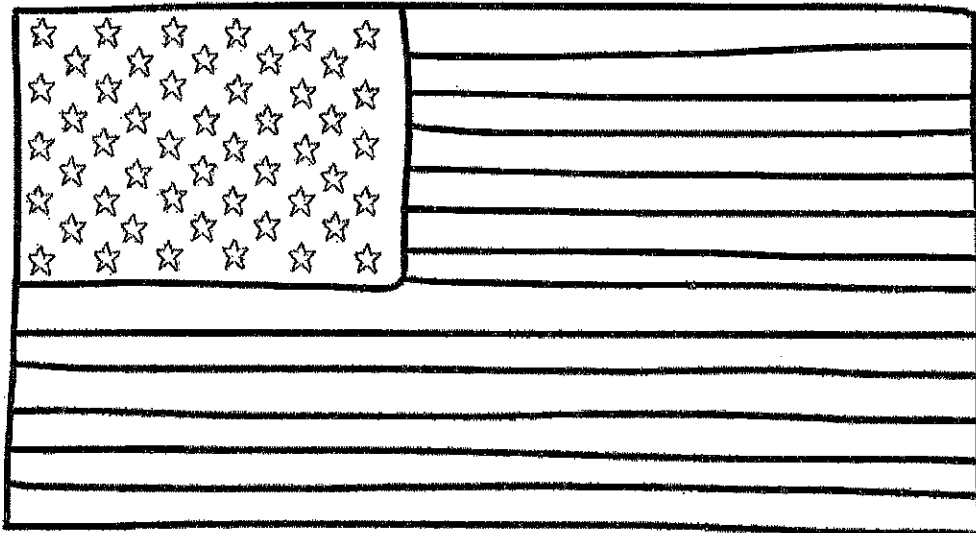
Red is a symbol of **valor (courage)**.



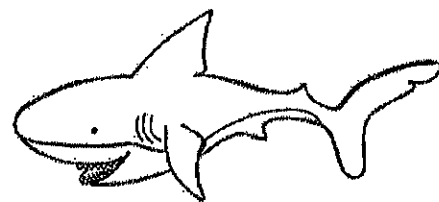

Materials: Deck of Cards (with face cards removed)
and at least 2 players

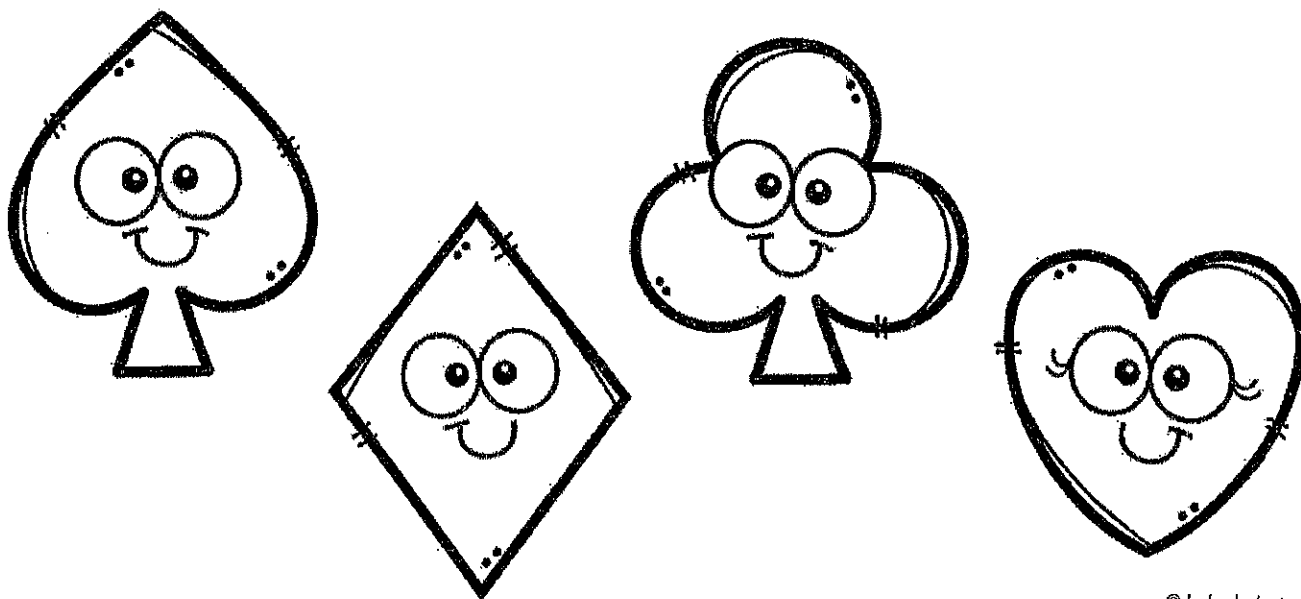
This fast-paced game will help students master doubles facts!

To begin, players take turns flipping over one card per turn. The players try to be the first to “double” the number shown.

For example, if a 3 is turned over, the players quickly add $3 + 3$ and call out 6! The player who calls out the correct answer first wins the card.

Play continues until all cards in the deck are used. The player with the most cards at the end of the game is the winner.

To make the game a bit more challenging, players can call out the Doubles + 1 fact. So if a 3 is turned over, the player who says, “ $3 + 3 + 1$ is seven” first would be the winner!

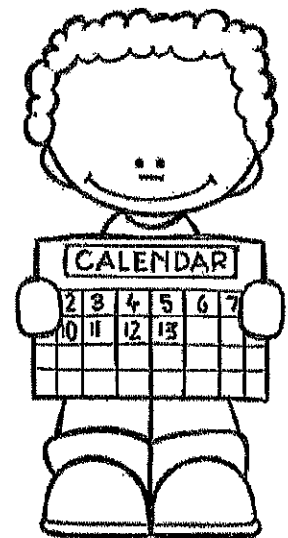

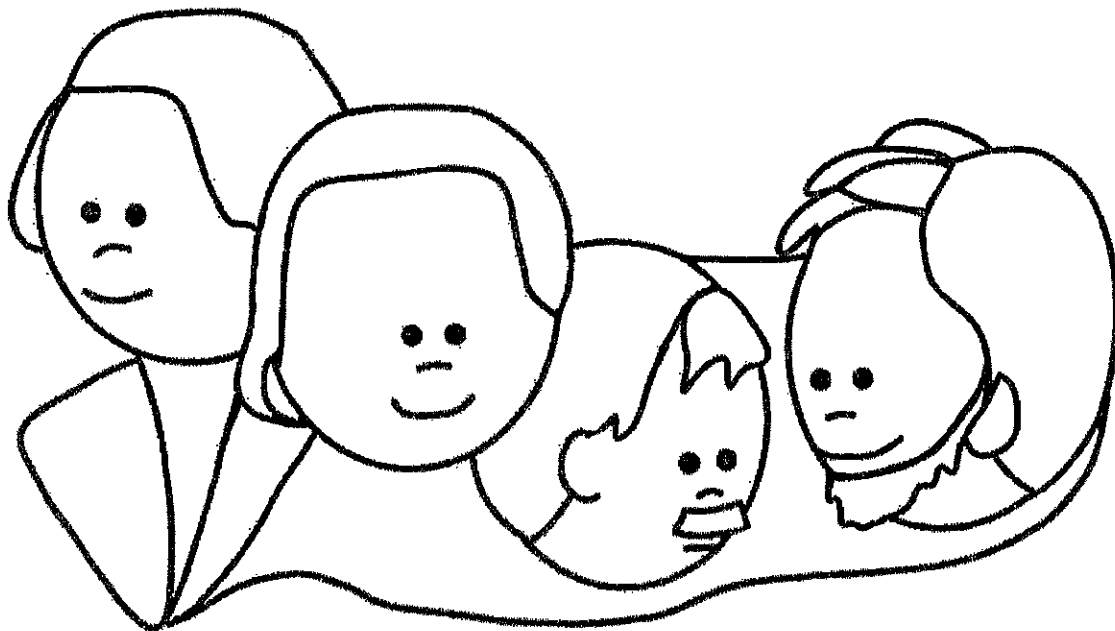
Mount Rushmore
