4 English, 4 Math, 3 Social Studies, 3 Science (13 credits)

9th Core:

Personalized Pathways to explore

Traditional pathway

The traditional pathway gives students the opportunity to complete all classes in 9-12 on campus to satisfy the MME graduation requirements.

Dual Enrollment*

Delta College's Dual Enrollment Program is for students enrolled in **9th - 12th grade** and lets you get started on your college education, while still in high school. Courses are geared towards college and career readiness, with options available in both Transfer and Career Pathways.

Early Middle College*

Beginning their Junior year, the EMC gives students an opportunity to earn 30 college credits that satisfy the Michigan Transfer Agreement, an associate's degree, or a career certificate along with their high school diploma. Students will be able to save both time and money as they pursue a college degree, and they will have an additional year of high school (13th grade attending college full time) to complete their college program at Delta College or Davenport University. All classes and fees are paid for by the school district.

9th

- ◆ Get involved in clubs, sports and activities
- ◆ Plan program of classes you want to take
- ◆ Begin to keep track of important documents or notes
- ◆ Start to think about and explore post-secondary programs you may want to attend. Ex. Trade Schools, Colleges, Universities

10th

- ◆ Continue to stay involved or get involved
- ◆ Learn about different levels of courses such as Strategic, Honors, Advanced Placement
- ◆ Update your file with important documents and notes
- ◆ Begin or continue to visit post-secondary programs
- ◆ Prepare for standardized testing opportunities (SAT, ACT)

11th

- ◆ Continue to stay involved or get involved
- ◆ Maintain acceptable grades for your path of study
- ◆ Continue to explore and visit post-secondary programs
- ◆ Prepare for and take needed standardized tests
- ◆ Explore financial side of post-secondary programs

12th

- ◆ Finalize pathway and final year of classes
- ◆ Apply to post-secondary programs
- ◆ Apply for Financial Aid (FAFSA) and scholarships/grants
- ◆ Decide on your post-secondary program and pathway.
