Announcement: Grading Practices for 4th Quarter 2020

It is important for the education and mental health of all students during this time of school dismissal for students to **STAY ENGAGED** in learning activities. Carbon School District will continue to ensure that students are provided with meaningful learning activities throughout the duration of the school dismissal.

We wish to relieve any unnecessary worry or concern over grades at this difficult time. Our expectation is for students to **STAY ENGAGED** each school day with these learning activities.

The following will be the grading practice that will be adopted by all teachers in the Carbon School District.

- Students who are **NOT ENGAGED** in participating in learning activities will receive a **“P”** grade.
 - The **“P”** grade does not harm nor does it help a student’s overall Grade Point Average (GPA)
- Students who **STAY ENGAGED**, regardless of their actual performance, will receive an **“A”** grade.
 - In order to receive an **“A”** grade, students will simply need to **STAY ENGAGED** each school day with learning activities provided by their teachers. All students who are engaged in the learning activities will receive an **“A”** grade.

This grading practice will hold students harmless for the unavoidable negative impact the coronavirus and school dismissal has had on their academics. Our goal is to ensure that no child’s grades are harmed by events and circumstances that are not in their control.

Special Notes:

1. It is very important for a student’s mental health and intellectual health to **STAY ENGAGED** with learning activities. Students who do not **STAY ENGAGED** will be further behind in their education and may experience mental health issues as a result of not having a focus or tasks to complete.
